

TWENTY-NINTH DAY

Tuesday, March 10, 2020

The House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, convened at 12:02 p.m., with Vice Speaker Nakashima presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Ms. Eva Momosea, a national American Sign Language story winner, after which the Roll was called showing all members present with the exception of Representatives DeCoite and McDermott, who were excused.

Representative Cabanilla Arakawa commended the honorees for advocating for equality for women in surfing.
