The House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, convened at 12:04 p.m., with Vice Speaker Nakashima presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Representative Linda Ichiyama, after which the Roll was called showing all members present with the exception of Representatives Gates, McKelvey, Saiki, and Thielen, who were excused.
