

FIFTIETH DAY

Thursday, July 2, 2020

The House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, convened at 12:05 p.m., with Vice Speaker Nakashima presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Representative Val Okimoto, after which the Roll was called showing all members present, with Representatives Creagan, DeCoite, Har, Matayoshi, Matsumoto, Perruso, Thielen, and Wildberger participating remotely via videoconference, and with the exception of Representative Gates, who was excused.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Forty-Ninth Day was deferred.

FINAL READING

Representative Belatti moved to agree to the amendments made by the Senate to the following House Bill, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried: (Representative Gates was excused.)

H.B. No. 361, HD 1, SD 2:

Representative Belatti moved that H.B. No. 361, HD 1, SD 2 pass Final Reading, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I rise in strong support, and a few comments. First, I'd like to thank the author of this bill, the Speaker. I'd also like to think that I have some skin in the game, having first introduced it probably five years or so prior. But it's something whose time is now, and it's something for the future to consider. Five years ago, this bill was probably at its peak, when people understood that our current mayor actually had \$200,000 in emoluments that we were surprised to learn about.

"But, Mr. Speaker, this is nothing new, actually. Emoluments have been around and, through the research office, since the confederacy, Articles of Confederation said there are no emoluments allowable. So, this has been a really strict scrutiny, if you will, of people who will get favor because of the positions they have. And quite frankly, it's the human condition, which is really why the US Constitution is so good. Because it knows the weaknesses if we gave it all to a monarchy. Well, we got a legislature, if we gave it all to the legislature. We have an executive, and if we let them have it, we give it to the Judiciary.

"So, these are the same spirit, if you will, checks and balances. And this is saying it's time now, that if you're a mayor, if you're a governor, even

though it doesn't say lieutenant governor, I'm assuming that it's implied, that you will not have any outside employment, you will not have any outside gifts. In fact, it gives it really extreme detail the things that you can and cannot do.

"And also, in the research at Civil Beat it said, actually, the present mayor would agree with this bill that we are talking about, if all elected officials, not just governors and mayors, were covered by it. Mr. Speaker, that sort of suggests that there's some people who think we don't probably need this. But ultimately, I think it's for the betterment. It makes us all, if I might say, in the public eye and in the business we're in. Perception is reality, and when the perception is that someone is paying us to be on a board a couple hundred thousand dollars more than we actually make, it's probably inappropriate.

"Here's the bottom line, Mr. Speaker. This bill will help ensure that corruption has no place in our state and counties' highest offices. And even the perception of it, because it will now be out of bounds. For those reasons, Mr. Speaker, it's an overdue bill, it's a good one, and I hope that everyone votes for this. Thank you."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.B. No. 361, HD 1, SD 2, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO EMOLUMENTS," passed Final Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Gates being excused.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Representative Ward: "Mr. Speaker, yesterday I would have made this announcement, but today I will do it with even more enthusiasm. The breach of trust of the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands is a historical landmark, that Leona Kalima and her 2,700 plaintiffs won a 5-0 with the Supreme Court.

"That is really noteworthy of an announcement. It's kind of a wake-up call for the 5th Floor. It's a wake-up call for this body. One hundred years ago, ladies and gentlemen, we said we were going to put Hawaiians back on the land because the land was lost. And this is a strict shot across our bow saying, guys, let's do what we promised to do 100 years ago and we still haven't done it.

"The second announcement, Mr. Speaker, is on the Fourth of July we became a free people. And hopefully that will remain, given what some of the things are going on historically on the mainland. And we are probably a good example of how freedom should be expressed when we have a disagreement with our government, when we have a disagreement with our history, we work it out, hopefully, in bodies such as this. For those reasons, Mr. Speaker, those are two announcements I think are very, very important. Thank you."
