The House of Representatives of the Thirty-First Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, convened at noon, with Speaker Saiki presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Representative Sean Quinlan, after which the Roll was called showing all members present, with Representative Har participating remotely via videoconference, and with the exception of Representatives Todd, Ward, and Woodson, who were excused.

Representative Ganaden rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, in strong support. Mr. Speaker, HSCR 1516, HR 57 designates September as Suicide Prevention and Action Month. Mr. Speaker, I've not lived very long on this planet, but I've already lost three friends in this manner. And to speak of suicide often is to acknowledge the shadow, as it is the thing not to be named.

"There is an increasing body of knowledge that suggests that what we have intuited, that taking one own's life has more to do with debt, the loss of a job, a home, or a relationship than it does with persistent mental health issues, and by that logic, everything that we do here in this building that increases the social safety net, that gives young people hope, will lead to a reduction in preventable loss of life.

"The Department of Health has done an excellent job of tracking these numbers throughout the pandemic. We gratefully did not see an uptick as was predicted in statistics, but it must be noted, as noted in the testimony, that in Hawaii, one person died by suicide every two days.

"Mr. Speaker, this measure is only important in so much as we talk about it, as we destigmatize reaching out to discuss mental health. In the realm of criminal justice and particularly family violence, we know that tools that support mental health are a key factor to reducing both criminality and suicidal ideation, and especially for men of color, we must destigmatize reaching out.

"Many thanks to the introducers, to the organizations across Hawaii like the Keala Foundation, to healthcare centers, and the hundreds of individuals across the state doing this important work. Thank you."
