

TWENTY-NINTH DAY

Monday, March 14, 2022

The House of Representatives of the Thirty-First Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, convened at 12:02 p.m., with Vice Speaker Mizuno presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Representative Angus L.K. McKelvey, after which the Roll was called showing all members present, with Representative Ichiyama participating remotely via videoconference, and with the exception of Representative Kitagawa, who was excused.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Twenty-Eighth Day was deferred.

INTRODUCTIONS

The following introductions were made to the members of the House:

Representative McKelvey introduced his nephew visiting from North Carolina, James Nicklaus Dockins; his wife, Valerie McKelvey; and his office manager, Wendee Wilson.

Representative Ward introduced House staff and newlyweds, Jay Payne and Tiana Elisara-Payne.

ORDER OF THE DAY**REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES**

Representative Luke, for the Committee on Finance, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1027-22) recommending that H.B. No. 1600, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be placed on the calendar for Third Reading.

Representative Belatti moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 1600, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be placed on the calendar for Third Reading, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"In support with a very brief comment. Because before third reading, I hope it can change one thing and there's one thing missing, otherwise it's a great bill. What's missing is the founding of the first pharmaceutical industry in the State of Hawaii to prevent COVID because of the tests. And I've spoken, I know you guys don't want to hear, but you have to hear it. Spit in a cup, \$20, 10 minutes, and COVID is over. That's Oceanit, Patrick Sullivan. It should be in the budget. He needs a small amount to form the first pharmaceutical industry in the State of Hawaii. I can't say it loud and strong enough. But we've got a \$16 billion budget and if we can't give some chump change to start the prevention of COVID for the future of the State of Hawaii, for the people of Hawaii, we are conspicuously absent. For those things, Mr. Speaker, I'll save the \$600 million for the Hawaiians for the third reading. Thank you."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1600, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE STATE BUDGET," passed Second Reading and was placed on the calendar for Third Reading, with Representative Kitagawa being excused.

Representatives Tarnas and Hashem, for the Committee on Water & Land and the Committee on Agriculture, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1028-22) recommending that H.C.R. No. 17 be referred to the Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs.

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committees was adopted and H.C.R. No. 17, entitled: "HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO CONVENE A TASK FORCE TO DEVELOP A FERAL UNGULATE MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR WEST HAWAII," was referred to the Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs, with Representative Kitagawa being excused.
