Our colleague, back in 1990, Mr. Speaker, she and I used to basically debate the whole House of Representatives. And this is a great honor to her, in addition to all the other things, as known as the hemp lady. And I know Charlotte is in the balcony, who will give her blow-by-blow description of what we're talking about. But so everyone knows that she's very active, of you've read the Star Advertiser recently, she had an op-ed. So, she is as strong as ever. And it's a great honor to honor her again on this floor. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Marten rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Also rising in support. I just want to mention that this bike path that she was part of making a reality wasn't something she did as a legislator, it's something she did as a mother and a community member. And this bike path, which runs right by my house, is used by people all over Oahu. People come there to exercise. And it's become this amazing community resource and just goes to show what citizens, neighbors can do when they put their mind to it. And hopefully we will pave the way for them to do things like that. Thank you."

Someday soon probably we will have them in Hawaii.

"But in support of this resolution I just want to add one thing in that, when I worked at USAID in the Office of Democracy and Governance, we had a conference in Kyiv, not Kiev, that's the way the Russians say it. I did a jog around the national track and listening to the people of Ukraine, sometimes, Mr. Speaker, it was like they loved democracy and freedom more than we as Americans. They were just so much to the genuineness of what it's about to be a spirit of freedom. And I only say that to say that when we hear President Zelensky start talking about we're going to fight to the end, they really mean that, Mr. Speaker. And this is a great gesture from the State of Hawaii to say, hey, we're with you, we support you, and these refugees hopefully are going to be taken care of."

Representative McKelvey rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Also in strong support. And in the spirit of bipartisanship, would like the words of the previous speaker, except for jogging around the capital, entered into the record as if they were my own," and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)
