Thursday, February 2, 2023

The House of Representatives of the Thirty-Second Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2023, convened at 12:03 p.m., with Vice Speaker Ilagan presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Representative Andrew Takuya Garrett, after which the Roll was called showing all members present with the exception of Representatives Amato, Nakashima, and Woodson, who were excused.

On motion by Representative Morikawa, seconded by Representative Garcia and carried, reading of the Journal was dispensed with and the Journals of the First, Second, and Third Days were approved. (Representatives Amato, Ichiyama, Nakashima, and Woodson were excused.)

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 24, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO WATER COMMON CARRIERS," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, with Representatives Ganaden, Hussey-Burdick, and Perruso voting aye with reservations, with Representative Kapela voting no, and with Representatives Amato, Nakashima, and Woodson being excused.
