Tuesday, February 6, 2024

The House of Representatives of the Thirty-Second Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2024, convened at 12:08 p.m., with Vice Speaker Ilagan presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Representative Bertrand Kobayashi, after which the Roll was called showing all members present with the exception of Representatives Kapela, Nakashima, and Ward, who were excused.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Twelfth Day was deferred.

Representative Garcia rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"In opposition. This bill takes away the court's authority to hold lawbreakers accountable. It removes all fines assessed to minors. I think we're sending a bad message here, that when you break the law there's no penalty attached to it. And one issue was brought up in committee that, well, there are families who can't afford these fines. Well, the court already has set precedents where, if families cannot afford, those kids and families can opt in for community service. So, it's a bill that sends the wrong message to our residents here in Hawai'i. No vote."

Representative Pierick rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"No. To reiterate the representative from Kapolei's perspective, this bill is going to repeal the curfew for children in Hawai'i. When I was going door to door in Royal Kunia, one of our constituents asked me to enforce curfew, because sometimes the kids get rambunctious at night. So, we want to make sure that our communities are safe.

"And to reiterate the topic of fines, if somebody is going to commit a crime, they should prepare to serve the time or in this case, pay the fine. So, I believe that fines are smart in punishing children for doing wrong. As a child being raised in Hawai'i, my parents punished me by fining me when I

did something wrong, and I think that's something that the rest of our children should experience when they break the law."

Representative Quinlan rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"In opposition. I have stumbled upon a very simple method to avoid fines and court costs. Don't commit crimes. Thank you."

Representative Matsumoto rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Alcos rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Kong rose and asked that the Clerk record an no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Perruso rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. In strong support. The data shows, and we do have national and also Hawai'i-specific data that shows that when we do work around the juvenile justice system and seek to address the causes of juvenile engagement with the justice system rather than creating a more strict penal system, we also help to address the school-to-prison pipeline. And I think that it is in the best interest of all of our communities that we do that work as soon as possible."

Representative Kila rose and asked that the Clerk record an no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Gates rose and asked that the Clerk record an no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Holt rose and asked that the Clerk record an no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Garcia rose to respond, stating:

"Still in opposition. Once again, bad precedent, and we're sending the wrong message. It was mentioned that once again, families who can't afford these things are normally Hawaiian families. I think that's not the right notion to mention for these issues. Once again, the message must be clear that when you break the law, there needs to be a penalty paid. And it makes no sense why just because they're minors, they cannot pay fines. It's called teaching children lessons. You break the law. You pay the fine."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 2722, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO YOUTH FEES AND FINES," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs, with Representatives Alcos and Matsumoto voting aye with reservations, with Representatives Garcia, Gates, Holt, Kila, Kong, Pierick, and Quinlan voting no, and with Representatives Kapela, Nakashima, and Ward being excused.

Representative Tarnas, for the Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 80-24) recommending that H.B. No. 1913, as amended in HD I, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Representative Nakamura, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Kapela, Nakashima, and Ward being excused.

Representative Tarnas, for the Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 82-24) recommending that H.B. No. 1608, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

Representative Nakamura moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 1608, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Takayama rose to disclose a potential conflict of interest, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, may I ask for a ruling on a potential conflict? My daughter works as a public defender," and the Chair ruled, "no conflict."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1608, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF THE PUBLIC DEFENDER," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Kapela, Nakashima, and Ward being excused.

Representative Tarnas, for the Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 83-24) recommending that H.B. No. 2570, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

Representative Nakamura moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 2570, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Souza rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Ganaden rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Same request, Mr. Speaker. After the Lahaina fires, many residents were concerned about advertisements from outside law firms working with local counsel to represent victims of the fire. This rule, I think, would better be handled by rules of the Supreme Court and by rules that govern attorneys. For that reason, I'm going to be voting with the reservations."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 2570, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO ATTORNEYS," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Ganaden and Souza voting aye with reservations, and with Representatives Kapela, Nakashima, and Ward being excused.

Representative Perruso, for the Committee on Higher Education & Technology, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 84-24) recommending that H.B. No. 2359, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.

On motion by Representative Nakamura, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 2359, HD I, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE HAWAII BROADBAND AND DIGITAL EQUITY OFFICE," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, with Representatives Kapela, Nakashima, and Ward being excused.

Representative Perruso, for the Committee on Higher Education & Technology, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 85-24) recommending that H.B. No. 2113, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.

Representative Nakamura moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 2113, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Garcia rose and asked that the Clerk record an no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Pierick rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"No vote. This bill establishes the Daniel K. Inouye College of Pharmacy Special Fund to support pharmacists, workforce assessment, and planning efforts. I think public education is a great idea. I think we should fund people getting smarter. At the same time, there are a lot of smart people in our state without college degrees. We can include truck drivers, plumbers, waitresses, and other service jobs that don't require degrees. These people would be paying taxes towards other people benefiting from a college degree.

"So, I think we should be fair and allow people to pursue education, but in a private capacity. There are members in this body that support scholarships. They use their own funds to create scholarships for private schools, even in the Senate, that happens. So, I support school that is in the private sector where people have to get it without using tax dollars, but just get it because they can apply for a scholarship or things like that."

Representative Kong rose and asked that the Clerk record an no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Alcos rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Perruso rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"In support. Just to clarify, this measure simply creates a special fund and creates a mechanism whereby pharmacists, like many other folks in different medical professions, can collect fees, professional fees, so that they can strengthen and enhance the work of their profession. So, it does not levy a tax on the general public or in any way further burden the general public."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. on Finance, with Representatives Kapela, Nakashima, and Ward being excused.

Representative Tarnas, for the Committee on Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 89-24) recommending that H.B. No. 1865, as amended in HD I, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

Representative Nakamura moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 1865, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Pierick rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"In support. This bill appropriates funds to the Department of the Prosecuting Attorney of the City & County of Honolulu for the Career Criminal Prosecution Unit. I believe our law enforcement officers need to be well funded and our prosecutors need to prosecute. Right now, we've got criminals roaming the streets that aren't being prosecuted. The police detain them, the prosecutors don't prosecute, and then the judge let them go. So, I hope that these funds go towards hard prosecutions."

Representative Ganaden rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"No vote, Mr. Speaker. It's been in the news, pretty thoroughly, the differences in opinion in the ways that crime should be prosecuted between the State and the Office of the Prosecutor here in Honolulu County. The prosecutor has declined to prosecute any state crimes, and now they are asking for an increase in funding for career criminals. I don't think that this would have stopped the career criminals like the Kealohas or numerous other individuals that have operated throughout our community with impunity. I think that this is a matter of priorities with the prosecutor, and they have ample funding to prioritize career criminals if they wish to do so."

Representative Perruso rose and asked that the Clerk record an no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1865, HD I, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE CAREER CRIMINAL PROSECUTION PROGRAM," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Ganaden and Perruso voting no, and with Representatives Kapela, Nakashima, and Ward being excused.
