Monday, March 25, 2024

The House of Representatives of the Thirty-Second Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2024, convened at 12:02 p.m., with Vice Speaker Ilagan presiding.

The Roll was called showing all members present with the exception of Representatives Ganaden, Kapela, and Woodson, who were excused.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Thirty-Eighth Day was deferred.

ORDER OF THE DAY

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS
(FLOOR PRESENTATIONS)

The following resolution (H.R. No. 222) was announced by the Clerk and the following action taken:

H.R. No. 222, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING CHAD BUCK, FOUNDER AND CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF THE HAWAII FOODSERVICE ALLIANCE, LLC, FOR BEING A BEACON OF LIGHT AND HOPE BY IMMEDIATELY DISTRIBUTING AID TO THE LAHAINA WILDFIRE DISASTER VICTIMS DURING THEIR DARKEST HOURS," was offered by Representative M. Mizuno.

Representative M. Mizuno moved that H.R. No. 222 be adopted, seconded by Representative Saiki.

Representative M. Mizuno recognized Chad Buck for leading the largest civilian response to a natural disaster in the history of Hawai'i, delivering millions of dollars of food, water, ice, medical supplies, clothing, and heavy equipment to the people of Lahaina immediately following the wildfire; honored Chad as a leader who displays the fundamental principles of spirit of *aloha*, *ohana*, leadership, love, and compassion; and congratulated and introduced honorees who were seated on the Floor of the House:

Chad Buck, Founder and CEO, Hawai'i Food Service Alliance; and Stephanie Buck, his wife, Executive Vice President and CFO, Hawai'i Food Service Alliance.

Representative Saiki honored Chad and Stephanie for all the work they have done for the State of Hawai'i, building their business into the largest local food distributor in our state and always being responsive to the needs of our community; highlighted their work during the COVID-19 pandemic supplying many community-based efforts to provide food, water, ice, and other supplies to those in need; commended their philosophy and development of a program to help former inmates by providing them with training and opportunities for work and growth and development; and thanked the honorees for their service.

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.R. No. 222 was adopted, with Representatives Ganaden, Kapela, and Woodson being excused.

At 12:14 p.m., the Chair declared a recess to allow the members to meet and congratulate the honorees.

"Mr. Speaker, I rise in support. Mr. Speaker, I just saw the movie Sound of Freedom. If people haven't seen it, I highly recommend it. It really gives you upfront and close understanding of what this is really about. It's unbelievable all the tragedy that is happening.

"One of the takeaways is the fact that there is now more slavery in the world, now, when it's illegal, than when it was legal. And most of the slavery is young girls in the sex trafficking. So, Mr. Speaker, this is not a perfect thing aligning. I understand there's a part where it's not as stringent if we adopt the federal, but it's better than not having the other benefits of the federal. So, this is a good bill

"But, I cannot believe, and I know Hawai'i is part and parcel of that sex trafficking. Look at Sound of Freedom and you will be angry, but then you will weep or at least shed a tear. This is a good bill. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and S.B. No. 2757, SD 1, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO SEX TRAFFICKING," passed Third Reading by a vote of 48 ayes, with Representatives Ganaden, Kapela, and Woodson being excused.

Representative Nakamura moved that S.B. No. 3159, SD 1, HD 1 pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Morikawa.
