The House of Representatives of the Thirty-Second Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2024, convened at 12:07 p.m., with Vice Speaker Ilagan presiding.

ORDER OF THE DAY

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS
