Representative Matsumoto celebrated the Eddie Aikau Big Wave Invitational and shared how much the competition means to the community, reminding us what it truly means to charge forward with passion to embrace the ocean and to honor the values of respect, perseverance, and community; and congratulated Landon on his achievements.

Representative Alcos shared how Landon's winning wave was as high as the ceiling of the House Chamber.

I want to thank the chair of Human Services Committee and the chair for Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs for advancing this important bill. I want to acknowledge the hard work of all the advocates who have fought tirelessly to make this a reality.

"This bill is more than just policy. It is protecting lives. By increasing penalties for violations for temporary restraining orders and orders for protection, we are making it clear that domestic violence will not be tolerated in our communities. This measure ensures that offenders are held accountable and required to complete intervention programs aimed at breaking the cycle of abuse.

"We pass this bill in honor of Theresa Cachuela, whose life was tragically taken due to domestic violence. Her story is a painful reminder of why we must continue strengthening protections for survivors. Today, we honor her memory with action, ensuring that no family has to endure the same heartbreak. Thank you so much."

Representative Kila rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Madam Speaker, in support, may I request to adopt the words of the previous speaker and a brief comment. I also would like to thank the vice chair of Water & Land for being the House companion to this bill before us. As the previous speaker mentioned, Theresa Cachuela's life was tragically cut short. And as her mom, who lives in Nānākuli, has worked tirelessly this session for advocacy, this is a step in the right direction. And I'd like to echo the sentiments and thankfulness to the committee chairs for working on this measure," and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Representative Lamosao's written remarks are as follows:

"In strong support of this critical measure, which seeks to protect survivors of domestic abuse by ensuring that they are not forced into mediation in paternity and divorce proceedings against their will.

"Mediation can be a valuable tool for resolving disputes, but we must recognize that it is not always appropriate—especially in cases where domestic abuse has occurred. Survivors of abuse should never be placed in a position where they must negotiate with their abuser in a setting that could retraumatize them, diminish their sense of security, or coerce them into unfair agreements.

"This measure establishes clear and necessary protections. It prohibits courts from requiring mediation when domestic abuse has been alleged and a restraining order or protective order is in place. Furthermore, it mandates that mediators screen for domestic abuse and ensures that any mediation that

does occur is conducted in a manner that prioritizes the safety and well-being of the survivor.

"This legislation sends a strong and unequivocal message: that we will not subject survivors of abuse to further harm under the guise of conflict resolution. Instead, we stand with them, ensuring that they have the autonomy, protection, and support they need during some of the most difficult legal proceedings of their lives."
