Tuesday, April 15, 2025

The House of Representatives of the Thirty-Third Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2025, convened at 11:40 a.m., with Vice Speaker Ichiyama presiding.

On motion by Representative Todd, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. No. 163, SD 1, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE COUNTIES TO ADOPT FLEXIBLE SETBACK REQUIREMENTS OR ESTABLISH VARIANCE PROCEDURES FOR STATE BUILDINGS AND FACILITIES TO ENHANCE LAND USE

and the many challenges that we have. So, that's my purpose of opposing this. Thank you, Madam Speaker."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. No. 196, SD 1, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION SUPPORTING AND ENCOURAGING A BROADER RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE STATE AND THE KINGDOM OF NORWAY," was adopted, with Representatives Garcia and Shimizu voting no, and with Representative Cochran being excused.

Representative Ilagan, for the Committee on Economic Development & Technology, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 2110) recommending that S.C.R. No. 195 be adopted.

On motion by Representative Todd, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. No. 40, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE HAWAII TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION TO INCREASE ITS FOCUS ON ADVANCED MANUFACTURING AND CYBERSECURITY TO ALLOW LOCAL MANUFACTURERS TO EXPAND PRODUCTION, LOWER COSTS, AND CREATE NEW PRODUCTS," was adopted, with Representative Cochran being excused.

"Thank you, Madam Speaker. With reservations and a brief comment. I totally appreciate the East-West Center and the efforts. I would hope that

they would focus on the East-West mission of our Asia-Pacific area. Thank you, Madam Speaker."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. No. 178, SD 1, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION URGING THE EAST-WEST CENTER TO EXPAND INTERNATIONAL ENGAGEMENT AROUND THE WORLD AND SERVE AS A BRIDGE TO HELP THE STATE SHARE ITS UNIQUE EXPERTISE WITH TROPICAL AGRICULTURE, FOOD SECURITY, PUBLIC HEALTH, EDUCATION, CLEAN ENERGY, AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT, WHERE IT MIGHT BE MOST HELPFUL TO OTHER COMMUNITIES AROUND THE WORLD," was adopted, with Representative Shimizu voting aye with reservations, with Representatives Garcia and Pierick voting no, and with Representative Cochran being excused.

Representative Ilagan, for the Committee on Economic Development & Technology, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 2114) recommending that S.C.R. No. 65 be adopted.

Representative Todd moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that S.C.R. No. 65 be adopted, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Iwamoto rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Holt rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you in strong support. And may I please request permission to insert written comments into the Journal. Thank you."

Representative Holt's written remarks are as follows:

"Thank you, Madam Speaker. I rise today in strong support of the redevelopment of Aloha Stadium and the creation of the surrounding entertainment district—a visionary project that will not only revitalize a historic venue, but also transform an underutilized area into a dynamic hub of sports, culture, and commerce for the people of Hawai'i.

"For decades, Aloha Stadium has been more than just a structure—it has been a gathering place. A site where generations have come together to cheer for the University of Hawai'i Warriors, to attend world-class concerts, and to celebrate community. But like all aging infrastructure, the stadium has reached a critical point. The time for patchwork repairs has passed. We must look to the future with boldness, not band-aids.

"The redevelopment project presents a once-in-a-generation opportunity. Not only will we build a modern, multi-purpose stadium capable of hosting sporting events, concerts, and festivals, but the surrounding entertainment district will breathe new life into this region. With thoughtful planning and community input, we envision a vibrant neighborhood—complete with housing, retail, restaurants, open green spaces, and year-round activities that will create jobs and stimulate our local economy.

"This is about more than just construction. It's about creating opportunity—for workers, for small businesses, for families, and for future generations. It's about building a space that reflects the unique culture and spirit of Hawai'i—a place where local and visitor alike can experience the best of what we have to offer.

"Moreover, this project exemplifies smart public-private partnership. It represents responsible investment and long-term vision. It will generate revenue, not just expenses. And it can serve as a model for how we approach large-scale infrastructure projects moving forward—with transparency, community engagement, and a commitment to sustainability.

"Let us honor the legacy of Aloha Stadium by building something worthy of its name. Let us invest in a future where our *keiki* can play, our artists can perform, our communities can thrive, and our stories can be shared.

"I urge my colleagues to support the continued redevelopment of Aloha Stadium and the creation of the surrounding entertainment district. Together, we can turn this vision into a reality."

Representative Pierick rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. No. 65, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION URGING THE STADIUM AUTHORITY TO FINALIZE A CONTRACT FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE NEW ALOHA STADIUM AND TO CONTINUE ITS EFFORTS IN EARNEST TO CREATE THE NEW ALOHA STADIUM ENTERTAINMENT DISTRICT," was adopted, with Representatives Iwamoto and Pierick voting no, and with Representative Cochran being excused.

No. 197, SD 1, HD 1, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING JUNE 21, 2025, AS INDIGENOUS PEOPLE'S DAY, JULY 1, 2025, AS CANADA DAY, AND SEPTEMBER 30, 2025, AS TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION DAY, IN ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF THE ENDURING FRIENDSHIP BETWEEN THE PEOPLE OF CANADA AND HAWAII, THE INDEPENDENT SOVEREIGNTY AND SELF-DETERMINATION OF THE PEOPLE OF CANADA, AND A COMMITMENT TO NEVER AGAIN ALLOW THE SOVEREIGN RIGHT OF A PEOPLE TO SELF DETERMINATION TO BE TAKEN AGAINST THEIR WILL," was adopted, with Representatives Garcia, Matsumoto, Muraoka, Pierick, and Shimizu voting no, and with Representative Cochran being excused.
