THIRTEENTH DAY

Wednesday, February 11, 2026

The House of Representatives of the Thirty-Third Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2026, convened at 12:07 p.m., with Vice Speaker Ichiyama presiding.

The Roll was called showing all members present.

"Even if a man goes to surgery, cuts off his penis, has a vagina sewed on, that doesn't make him a female. The chromosomes stay the same, the DNA stays the same. And in the DSM-5, you can get diagnosed with mental dysphoria if you have distress about your gender identity. I'm a licensed mental health counselor. There's a lot of people that can help people understand how God made them versus us as legislators encouraging people to change their gender. I'm voting no."
