Wednesday, April 1, 2026

The House of Representatives of the Thirty-Third Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2026, convened at 12:04 p.m., with Vice Speaker Ichiyama presiding.

The Roll was called showing all members present with the exception of Representative Gedeon.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Thirty-Sixth Day was deferred.

ORDER OF THE DAY

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS
(FLOOR PRESENTATIONS)

The following resolution (H.R. No. 209) was announced by the Clerk and the following action taken:

H.R. Representative Garcia moved that H.R. No. 209 be adopted, seconded by Representative Muraoka.

Representative Garcia recognized and commended Tumua as a leading voice in Hawai'i's entertainment community; highlighted his Honolulu upbringing and collegiate athletic background; commended his ability to connect with local audiences through culturally-grounded comedy; acknowledged his significant social media presence, sold-out performances, and national reach; emphasized his contributions during the COVID-19 pandemic in uplifting the community through local-style humor; noted his partnership with the Hawai'i Department of Health to support youth mental health through Teen Link Hawai'i; honored his role as a cultural ambassador representing Hawai'i's identity, values, and lived experiences; and congratulated and introduced honoree who was seated on the Floor of the House:

Tumua Tuinei, comedian and Cultural Influencer.

Representative Garcia also recognized his family who were seated in the gallery: his wife, Rachael; their daughter, Dovey; and his parents, Tom and Louise Tuinei.

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.R. No. 209 was adopted.

Representative Tarnas rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Madam Speaker, I rise in support. Thank you. I apologize, I just wanted to make note that the record of votes taken for this measure in the Judiciary & Hawaiian Affairs Committee is incorrect. It should reflect that representatives Garcia and Shimizu voted yes with reservations on the measure. So, the vote sheet attached to the committee report is incorrect. I've been assured by our great Chief Clerk's Office that the bill status for this measure will be corrected and the error will be noted in the House Journal. Thank you very much."

Representative Shimizu rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Thank you, Madam Speaker. I wanted to rise in support with reservations. Thank you to my awesome Judiciary chair for that follow-up. The reason that I have reservations is, my understanding is that the current law is already in place that allows this and I'm not sure if we need to pass another law. Thank you."

And they also have the responsibility of electing or firing the chief election officer. If the commission has a problem of selecting a chair in an appropriate time frame, the current statute allows for the chief justice to make that selection. I would offer that, to be consistent, we should allow the commission to continue their responsibility of hiring or firing the chief election officer and selecting the replacement as necessary. And if there is a time frame that is required, we should put that in the bill and allow the chief justice to make that decision so that we are consistent with the process. That's my suggestion and my reason for opposition. Thank you, Madam Speaker."
