Thursday, April 9, 2026

The House of Representatives of the Thirty-Third Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2026, convened at 12:07 p.m., with Speaker Nakamura presiding.

The Roll was called showing all members present with the exception of Representative Cochran.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Forty-First Day was deferred.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:31 p.m.

ORDER OF THE DAY SUSPENSION OF RULES

At this time, the Chair stated:

"Thank you, Madam Speaker. In strong support. Art is life, and so often it's forgotten, it's underfunded, and it's inaccessible in so many communities across our state. But I want to thank the advocates from the Hawai'i Youth Symphony and the many individuals who testified on this resolution and what was once a bill, on trying to increase data and access to arts education.

"Resolutions like this, that create an established task force where we can actually map communities that have art versus communities that don't, help us fill the gaps for some of these deserts. So, this is really foundational work for moving arts access forward for our state. So, again, thank you to the

advocates. And I'm really looking forward to the work that will come from this."

So, I'm not sure if they need to have more funding for this or they need to somehow figure it out and do

something internally to accomplish this. So, I just pose the question to accomplish this very important scope. Thank you, Madam Speaker."

So, for those reasons, with reservations."

"Thank you, Speaker. In support with a rather long comment. This resolution concerns the Aha Moku Advisory Committee administratively attached to the Department of Land and Natural Resources. I just want to recount for this body some of what we found during the conversation throughout this process.

"The committee is responsible for hiring, managing, and firing the executive director for the committee, yet the committee does not meet. It has not meaningfully convened in years. The committee is subject to the Sunshine Law, despite their adamant rejection of it. And the record is clear, it has not and has almost never been in compliance.

"At this point, the question is no longer whether the Sunshine Law applies. The Office of Information Practices has already weighed in on this issue. The question is now whether the decades-long pattern of not complying rises to the level of a willful violation. Because this appears to be more than neglect, it appears to be intentional avoidance of meeting.

"Even now, the committee continues to issue formal positions and testimony as if it were a functioning body, but these positions are not discussed or adopted in open meetings as required by law. They are not valid positions, and yet they continue to be issued and accepted by the BLNR.

"The committee has failed to provide required reports to the Legislature. Meanwhile, the committee receives \$286,000 in taxpayer funds. There is no record of the committee reviewing or approving any budget, no discussion, no vote on a budget, yet the executive director continues to submit budget requests every year on behalf of the committee, including their own salary without documented approval. There is no record of how the salary is set. In testimony it was said that the salary is a small portion of the budget when in fact the salary and fringe benefits account for more than half of the budget.

"We also heard that their funds are frozen or being withheld and that this is why the committee cannot meet, but this is not accurate. The department confirmed that the funds are available through a well-established process, the same one utilized by other attached agencies. So, the issue is not funding, the issue is administration. The chairperson of the committee stated that tracking money is not their style. But this is public money and there's no accountability. And if tracking is not their style, maybe there should be no funding to track.

"There's no record of performance evaluations. Again, no oversight, no accountability. And the committee does have rules. Rules do exist. They are posted publicly on the DLNR website, but they are not following the rules.

In fact, testimony confirmed that they were simply choosing to not follow them. Yet there is no vote or no repeal or no process identifiable in which they chose officially to decide to not follow their rules. Had the rules been followed, we would not be here today

"Not even the bill or this resolution was enough to compel the committee to meet to discuss these issues. Yet despite not meeting, testimony was still submitted to the Water & Land Committee as official without discussion, without adoption, and without proper consent of committee members.

"The most basic responsibility of the executive director is to convene the committee in a lawful manner. DLNR says oversight belongs to the committee, but the committee does not meet, which means there is no oversight. So, what we have is a publicly funded position that answers to no one, serving a committee that does not function.

"And this process has been the only way to bring these issues forward. And this matters because the purpose of the committee matters. The aha moku framework was meant to bring a traditional Native Hawaiian system of resource management into state decision making to ensure a holistic approach to land and ocean and cultural stewardship. That vision is important and it's worth protecting, but it is not being realized. Instead, it's being held in dysfunction.

"This is not an attack on that vision. It's about restoring it through accountability, through compliance, through function. Because right now, we're not just dealing with a system that's not working, we're dealing with a system that hasn't worked for more than a decade. And we're not just dealing with dysfunction, we are funding the deliberate avoidance of accountability."

Representative Tarnas rose to yield his time, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Poepoe continued, stating:

"Thank you. I rest my case, but thank you."

Representative Garcia rose to speak in support of both measures, stating:

"In strong support, thank you. And I'd like to adopt the words of the previous speaker as my own. This is a very important issue, which has gone overlooked for way too long. Thank you," and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Representative Shimizu rose to speak in support of both measures, stating:

"Thank you, Madam Speaker. In support. I just want to thank the Judiciary vice chair for her work on this. I know it was a very sensitive issue, but I'm just really proud of the courage that she showed in having difficult conversations and being very tactful and professional about it. So, in support. Thank you."

Representative Kila rose in support of both measures and asked that the remarks of the representative from Moloka'i be entered into the Journal as his own, and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Representative Kapela rose to speak in support of both measures, stating:

"Thank you, Madam Speaker. In strong support. May I also adopt the words of the representative from Moloka'i as if they were my own," and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Representative Kahaloa rose to speak in support of both measures, stating:

"Thank you, Madam Speaker. Same request."

Representative Perruso rose to speak in support of both measures, stating:

"Same request."

Representative Souza rose in support of both measures and asked that the remarks of the representative for Moloka'i be entered into the Journal as her own, and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

"Aloha Chair and Members, I respectfully offer my strong support for HCR No. 185 / HR No. 175, which urges all county planning and permitting agencies to deny permits for the construction, expansion, or use of warehouses intended for immigration detention by U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE).

"This measure reflects a clear and important stance: Hawai'i is not a place where systems of mass detention should take root.

"HCR No. 185 / HR No. 175 responds to growing national efforts to expand immigration detention infrastructure, including the use of large warehouse-style facilities to hold individuals facing deportation. These facilities raise serious concerns about due process, humane treatment, and the long-term impacts on individuals, families, and communities.

"I stand in strong support of our immigrant communities, who are an essential part of Hawai'i's fabric. They deserve dignity, fairness, and protection—not systems that too often result in wrongful detainment, limited access to legal representation, and prolonged separation from their families. These harms are real, and they leave lasting impacts on our communities.

"As policymakers, we must ask ourselves what kind of systems we are willing to allow within our islands. The use of large-scale detention warehouses is not aligned with Hawai'i's values of dignity, compassion, and *mālama* for all people. These facilities often isolate individuals from their families and legal support, while placing strain on local resources and eroding community trust.

"This resolution is also about land use and community impact. Decisions around permitting are not neutral—they shape our landscape, the future of our neighborhoods, our infrastructure, and our sense of safety. Counties should retain the ability to prioritize uses of land that uplift communities, rather than contribute to systems rooted in incarceration and fear.

"Hawai'i has long stood as a place that values human dignity, cultural respect, and community well-being. By advancing this resolution, we affirm that our resources and lands should serve the people of Hawai'i—not be used to support policies that conflict with these principles.

"HCR No. 185 / HR No. 175 sends a strong and necessary message: Hawai'i will not facilitate the expansion of detention infrastructure that undermines the values we stand for.

"*Mahalo* for the opportunity to submit written remarks in strong support of this measure."

"Aloha Chair and Members, I support SB 2877, which creates a Student-Authored Book Publication Pilot Program for fifth-grade students in Kalihi public elementary schools.

"This bill is about giving our students the chance to see themselves as creators—not just learners. It invites them to tell their own stories, draw from their own experiences, and turn their ideas into something real that they can hold, share, and be proud of.

"For communities like Kalihi, our students have so much to say. They come from rich, diverse backgrounds, but don't always have the same opportunities to express that in the classroom. This program creates space for their voices to be heard and valued.

"By guiding students through researching, writing, illustrating, and publishing their own books, we're not only building literacy—we're building confidence, creativity, and a stronger sense of identity and belonging.

"It also supports broader educational goals by:

- Strengthening reading and writing skills through hands-on learning
- Encouraging creativity and critical thinking
- Making learning more culturally relevant
- Increasing student engagement in a meaningful way

"I also appreciate that this is a pilot program. It gives the Department of Education the opportunity to initiate, organize, and learn from what's already happening in some schools, while building a more structured and scalable approach to student authorship.

"At the end of the day, this is about investing in our *keiki*. When we give them the tools and space to tell their stories, we're helping shape confident, thoughtful leaders for Hawai'i's future.

"For these reasons, I respectfully ask for your support of SB 2877. *Mahalo* for the opportunity to submit written remarks."

Representative Garcia's written remarks are as follows:

"Madam Speaker, I rise in opposition to Senate Bill 2338, HD 2.

"At a time when families across Hawai'i are struggling with the cost of living, this Legislature is being asked to raise the salary cap for a state executive position using taxpayer dollars. This bill moves us in the wrong direction.

"Senate Bill 2338 increases the salary cap for the executive director of the Hawai'i Housing and Finance Development Corporation to a level not exceeding the governor's salary and raises compensation caps for senior staff. Supporters argue this is necessary for recruitment and program expansion, but the priorities reflected here are deeply misplaced.

"In the same legislative session, this body is considering renegeing on its promise to the people of Hawai'i regarding the 2024 tax cuts; relief residents were told they could rely on. To ask working families to absorb higher taxes or lost relief while increasing executive pay sends a clear and troubling message. This does not feel like a necessity. It feels betrayal.

"Compensation should be tied to performance. In communities like mine, residents continue to face unresolved issues on HHFDC-managed lands. Repeated concerns have been raised about severely overgrown and undermaintained road medians and surrounding vegetation, creating dangerously low visibility for drivers.

"If HHFDC is overextended, the solution should be restoring service levels, improving ground maintenance, and strengthening accountability, not increasing executive compensation while communities remain underserved.

"Madam Speaker, stewardship of public funds requires restraint. When trust is strained, promises of tax relief are being reconsidered, and residents are still waiting for basic services, now is not the time to ask the people of Hawai'i to pay more at the top.

"For these reasons, I respectfully urge my colleagues to oppose Senate Bill 2338, HD 2."
