Currently the Wai'anae Coast has the largest concentration of Hawaiians in the world. With the homesteads out there, and once all the planned DHHL projects are built out in the Kapolei region, it will then be the Kapolei area.

"So, looking forward in the next few decades, it would be prudent and acceptable for this body to make sure that eventually there is a full K-12 Hawaiian immersion campus in Hawai'i, but especially in West O'ahu. So, for those reasons, in support. And also, permission to insert written comments."

Representative Garcia's written remarks are as follows:

"Madam Speaker, I rise in strong support of Senate Concurrent Resolution 162, House Draft 1.

"For far too long, West O'ahu has lacked meaningful access to Hawaiian language education. SCR 162 is a necessary step toward correcting that. This resolution requires responsible action: a clear, structured planning process to establish a K-12 Kaiapuni school in Kapolei. At this moment, no K-12 Hawaiian Immersion Kaiapuni campus currently exists, and Kapolei is the perfect place to establish one.

"West O'ahu has the highest concentration of Native Hawaiian families in the state. Despite that, families are still required to send their children across the island to continue Hawaiian language education. That reality leads students to leave the Kaiapuni pathway altogether. Our State Constitution is clear. Article X, Section 4 requires Hawai'i to promote Hawaiian culture, history, and language. When large portions of our population are effectively excluded from a full K-12 immersion pathway, we are not meeting that responsibility.

"If passed, this legislation brings educators, administrators, parents, higher education, and community members together to develop a plan. It requires phased implementation, workforce planning, and regular reporting to the Legislature. That is accountability, and that is responsible governance. We regularly speak about keeping families in their communities, strengthening educational pathways, and preparing students for long term success. SCR 162 advances these goals.

"Madam Speaker, supporting this resolution is about fairness, follow through, and ensuring opportunity exists where the need is clear. It fulfills our constitutional responsibility to our people and our Native Hawaiian Community as a whole."
