Tuesday, March 25, 1975

The Senate of the Eighth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1975, convened at 11:30 o'clock a.m., with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by Mr. Cliff R. Scott, General Manager of KAIM, who is the Personal Representative of Billy Graham Association, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senator Nishimura who was excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Forty-Eighth Day.
