

## FIFTY-NINTH DAY

Thursday, April 10, 1975

The Senate of the Eighth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1975, convened at 11:30 o'clock a.m., with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by Reverend Bill Sever of the Kailua Church of the Nazarene, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Fifty-Eighth Day.

Senator Rohlffing asked if the Chairman of the Committee on Transportation would yield to a question, to which Senator O'Connor replied in the affirmative.

Senator Rohlffing then queried:

"Senator, with regard to this particular resolution, Senate

Concurrent Resolution No. 135, can you enlighten us as to the rule of the mass transit system insofar as the mileage and what the prospects, the prognosis, are for the ultimate continuation of the project from the Pearl City end to the Hawaii Kai end."

Senator O'Connor replied:

"Mr. President, the changes made by the House to Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 135 takes the feasible length of initial fixed guideway system at 14 miles from the Stadium at Halawa to Kahala Mall. This is the same length of initial segment which our resolution called for when it went over to the House.

This does not preclude the final construction of a 23-mile system from Hawaii Kai to Pearl City and I checked this afternoon with Mr. George Villegas who is running the mass transit system and he indicated that this was satisfactory for initial application for the system and would not preclude the eventual lengthening of the system."

Senator Rohlffing then said:

"Thank you, Senator. Mr. President, I rise to speak in favor of the resolution.

We have been concerned and we tried earlier in the session to point out our very real concern that this system that is being proposed should be a total system and it should be realized that the people who now reside and will reside as the area grows in Southeast Oahu, particularly in the Hawaii Kai area, are looking toward this system for at least partial relief of a very bad transportation situation.

Senator O'Connor is well aware of this, as are the other Senators from our District and so in endorsing this resolution at this late hour, there is no time to quibble on the ifs, ands or buts and in order to get this show on the road, we are going to go along with this. But I wish to make it very clear and I think the Senator's response underlines the point, that we are looking toward this system as the solution in increments to Hawaii Kai.

Thank you, Mr. President."

Senator Yee then stated as follows:

"Mr. President, I hate to disagree

with my colleague from the Seventh Senatorial District, but I am concerned and I have always been concerned, about the fixed guideway system for the island of Oahu. The last figures that I had seen just for 8 miles of fixed rail system between the airport and the University of Hawaii would be in the neighborhood of around \$800,000 and if we eventually talk about a 23-mile guideway system, we're talking about anywhere from one and a half to two billion dollars of cost that the citizens of Hawaii have to bear.

I can't help but feel that if we had a much more efficient bus system, we would be able to save all of this money and not tax our taxpayers to death. As I have said in the past, this will be a financial nightmare on the State of Hawaii and the taxpayers of Hawaii. Therefore, I will vote no on this measure."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and Roll Call vote having been requested, S.C.R. No. 135, H.D. 1, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION RELATING TO THE IMPLEMENTATION OF A RAPID TRANSIT SYSTEM FOR OAHU", was finally adopted on the following showing of Ayes and Noes:

Senator R. Wong then stated: "Yes, Mr. President, I will. This bill was taken into conference and a discussion revolved around the retirement system law raising the interest from 4-1/2 to 4-3/4%. The House originally asked for a 5% increase.

Pursuant to the discussion, Mr. President, a proposal was made that the bill should be amended that some consideration be given relative to retirement pay for public officers as well as legislators. At that point, Mr. President, the conferees on the part of the House requested and made a proposal to the conferees of the Senate. What this bill does, Mr. President..."

At 9:20 o'clock p.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 9:21 o'clock p.m., and the Chair recognized Senator R. Wong, who had the floor at the time of the recess.

Senator R. Wong continued: "Mr. President, a discussion relative to this bill in its final form does one thing. What it really does, it sets up the formula by which legislators' retirement allowances are determined.

It was the feeling of the Conference Committee, Mr. President, that the present formula be changed by a ratio of 2.5. On that basis, Mr. President, the Conference Committee Report was circulated and we are in agreement and I have prepared that report in the form of Conference Committee Report No. 35."

Senator Ching then asked: "Mr. Chairman, was this idea that was embodied in the Conference Committee draft, the amendment placed by the conferees, was this found in any bill introduced in the House or the Senate and was there a hearing held on this concept?"

Senator R. Wong said: "The answer is Yes, Mr. President."

Senator Ching then inquired what the bill number was.

Senator R. Wong answered: "It was not a bill, Mr. President. The subject matter and the title of the bill is a broad type of bill and can include anything under the broad title.

One of the suggestions made, Mr. President, was to take a look at public employees as well as legislators. As a result of that conference, Mr. President, the bill has been included to include legislative retirement. That is how it came out of conference.

There was a public...but not participation, but it was open to the public."

Senator Ching continued: "Mr. President, I don't think my question was quite answered. The concept that is embodied in the Conference Committee amendment, was that concept found in any bill or proposal that was before the legislature in the form of a bill or a resolution?"

Senator R. Wong answered: "No, not that I...there are several retirement bills before the legislature."

Senator Ching said: "Thank you very much."

Senator Nishimura then stated: "Mr. President, in connection with this bill, I would like to comment that the Senate Rules do not make such procedure as was taken by the Conference Committee illegal, improper or irregular. It is backed up by precedence in prior sessions of the legislature."

Senator Rohlfing then rose to speak against the appointment as follows:

"Mr. President, I rise to explain very briefly why I will vote no on the confirmation of E. Alvey Wright as Director of Transportation.

I'm sure some of you will remember last year when I spoke of my reservations but I did vote in favor of his confirmation at that time to fill out the one-year balance of the term of office.

As I made clear then, I now reiterate that I am not speaking against the man's character in any way. He's a nice guy. However, I am firmly convinced that Admiral Wright is not sufficiently committed to the kind of public transportation that we desperately need, nor is he willing to make consistent, courageous and objective decisions that will meet the critical long range transportation needs of this island in particular and of this State.

His answers to my questions at the public hearing of the Committee on Transportation on his nomination, documentary evidence on past and even current positions, make it irrevocably clear to me that Admiral Wright does not support the express public transit system which I believe we should have started building 15 years ago.

The people of Hawaii Kai, for example, desperately need short and long term relief from miserably congested traffic conditions. Yet Admiral Wright has seen fit to disregard in essence four very expensive and objective studies on the matter; studies, Mr. President, that have all called for a high speed public transit system to serve the entire 23-mile segment from Hawaii Kai to Pearl City. All of these studies clearly indicate that an 8.4 mile guideway from the airport to the University is insufficient and probably will not qualify for federal support. Yet in the hearing, Admiral Wright took the position in answer to direct questioning, that the 8.4 miles would be adequate and would suffice until 1995. I find that incredible.

One can put together with considerable ease an incredible compilation of inconsistent public statements by Admiral Wright on a wide range of transportation issues. Continually certain underlying themes keep reappearing. In addition to foot dragging on express transit, they include buoyant and unceasing enthusiasm for H-3 (and any other highway related project) flip-flopping on his Harbor Division's many problems, and defense of political machinations at the airport.

Mr. President, the man confirmed as Department of Transportation Director will run the biggest business of this State for four more years in charge of spending \$541 million over the biennium. That's a lot of kala in any league.

On the basis of his record on the State transportation issues, particularly the ones that affect the island of Oahu, on the basis of his answers to direct questions on long range transportation policy matters involving millions of taxpayers' dollars, and a way of life for our people, there is no way in which I can fulfill the trust that the voters of my District have placed in me over the past 16 years unless I vote No on this confirmation.

Thank you, Mr. President."

Senator O'Connor then rose to speak for the confirmation as follows:

"Mr. President, I rise to speak in favor of the confirmation. Mr. President, our Department of Transportation needs as its head, not only an able administrator, but an engineer. I am confident that Mr. Wright is each. He is a competent, qualified, capable engineer and as my illustrious colleague from the Seventh Senatorial District indicated, he has run successfully and for many years the largest business on this island which is the Pearl Harbor Naval Shipyard. He remained as its head and did a heck of a job before coming into State government. And he continues to be an able, excellent administrator in the Department of Transportation.

Admiral Wright has taken much criticism publicly on many issues, H-3 not being the smallest of them. But what my learned colleagues fail to realize is that he is carrying out the desires of this Body and this Legislature in taking the heated abuse which he does regularly in public hearings on the issues which we have voted him to take that abuse on. Sometimes, it's easy to forget that some of our public servants carry out the aims and ambitions of this Body and I would suggest that Admiral Wright has taken an awful lot of abuse because of some of the matters that this Body and our sister Body across the rotunda have passed and require him to carry out.

Many of the so-called 'flip-flops' that Admiral Wright has been accused of I witnessed, and I will say, Mr. President, that we have had a good amount of inaccurate reporting on the so-called 'flip-flops'. I for one have not seen a flip-flop in Admiral

Wright during this particular session of the Legislature.

He has strong personal convictions on many points but in many instances he subverts those strong personal convictions to do as this Body legislates and as the Executive Branch of the government--his boss, the Governor--directs him to do.

I would urge all of my colleagues to vote Aye on the confirmation of this able administrator and engineer.

Thank you."

Standing Committee Report No. 943 (Gov. Msg. Nos. 58, 68 and 72):

Senator F. Wong moved that Stand. Com. Rep. No. 943 be received and placed on file, seconded by Senator Hara and carried.

Senator F. Wong then moved that the Senate advise and consent to the nominations of Hideto Kono as Director, Department of Planning and Economic Development; John Farias, Jr. as Chairman, Board of Agriculture; and Christopher Cobb as Chairman, Board of Land and Natural Resources, seconded by Senator Hara.

Roll Call having been ordered, the motion to advise and consent to the nomination of Hideto Kono as Director, Department of Planning and Economic Development, term to expire December 4, 1978, was put by the Chair and carried on the following showing of Ayes and Noes:

Ayes, 25. Noes, none.

Roll Call having been ordered, the motion to advise and consent to the nomination of John Farias, Jr. as Chairman, Board of Agriculture, term to expire December 31, 1978, was put by the Chair and carried on the following showing of Ayes and Noes:

Ayes, 25. Noes, none.

The motion on the advise and consent to the nomination of Christopher Cobb as Chairman, Board of Land Resources, was put by the Chair and Senator Yim rose to speak against the nomination as follows:

"Mr. President, I rise to speak against the confirmation of Mr. Christopher Cobb as Director of the Department of Land and Natural Resources.

Mr. President, please allow me to preface my remarks by saying that at this time, there is no clear evidence of a conflict of interest for his appointment. However, my concern remains and therefore, I believe it is in the best interest of the people of this State to bring public attention to Mr. Cobb's appointment and to the far-reaching decisions he will make over the course of his term as Department Head.

In this matter I am particularly concerned with a contract that is now being negotiated between the Kaluakoi Corporation and the Board of Land and Natural Resources. The contract I refer to would rent use of the facilities of the Molokai Irrigation Water System to Kaluakoi Corporation. The contract is final except for the necessary consenting signature by the Director of the Department of Land and Natural Resources--which position we are now taking action on tonight.

In drafting the contract agreement, the Kaluakoi Corporation was represented by the same law firm that Mr. Cobb was affiliated with and for that reason I wish to call public attention as per the agreement in the contract that awaits Mr. Cobb's signature.

There are some defects in the agreement that I do not feel are in the best interest to the people and particularly to the Hawaiian Homesteaders on Molokai and I will take a few minutes this evening to briefly touch on them.

I am primarily concerned by the dangerously high salinity level of the water which Kaluakoi Corporation will be injecting into the irrigation system. This water will be 'flushed clean' in the system's reservoir which is filled with clean State water from wells located on State land on East Molokai. The mixed water will then be pumped through the pipelines

to West Molokai where the Corporation will remove the water.

I have strong reservations as to this use of State-owned low-salinity water. I understand this 'purification' benefit to the Corporation was included when drafting the contract rental agreement. However, I question if this sufficiently compensates the State for allowing the Corporation to cleanse its high-salinity water with low-salinity State water.

I have other reservations in regards to the rental price of the agreement which is a set figure for twenty years and based on 1970-base figures.

For twenty years the Kaluakoi Corporation will enjoy 1970-based rates while the other users of the irrigation system, the farmers and Hawaiian Homesteaders, will pay on-going rates necessary to maintain a self-supporting operation.

I also have reservations regarding the flow-rate clause of the agreement which guarantees Kaluakoi Corporation a maximum withdrawal of two million gallons per day but does not include a guarantee to the effect that Kaluakoi must inject an equal amount of water per day. I am concerned that without this stipulation it will be possible for Kaluakoi Corporation to withdraw water that it has not placed into the system prior to its removal.

Another concern in regards to the contract is the fact there is no wording in the contract regarding the rights of the original users of the Molokai Irrigation System, namely the Hawaiian Homesteaders of Molokai. However, the contract only addresses itself to the water needs of the 'public.' I fear that eventually the needs of the Hawaiian Homesteaders will be usurped in favor of the new population center in Western Molokai serviced by the Kaluakoi Corporation.

My final concern in regards to the contract is the fact that there is no penalty clause should the Corporation fail to observe any of the agreements of the contract including monitoring the input-outflow and the maximum salinity content of the corporation's water.

Mr. President, my concerns extend beyond reservations to this specific issue surrounding Mr. Cobb's appointment. It is my intent, by bringing public

attention to this nomination that Mr. Cobb be put on notice. For although there is no clear evidence of conflict of interest, the mere fact that he has been employed over the years by many large developers concerns me. As Director he will be making recommendations and policy decisions regarding large tracts of State lands...lands that are at present leased to contractors and developers in the State. I am fearful that he may unconsciously favor these large leaseholders and developers.

I wish to make it extremely clear that I raise my oppositions to Mr. Cobb's appointment at this time to make certain he appreciates the conditions under which he assumes his new position. I would hope that Mr. Cobb become sensitive towards his role as Director of the Department of Land and Natural Resources and make every effort to lean backwards to protect the public interest at all times and not to further or unjustly assist the personal interest of a select few such as the Kaluakoi Corporation.

Finally, Mr. President, this is just one appointment of many that I will be observing as the Senate moves on the advise and consent of the Governor's appointments and I hope Mr. Cobb will do honor to his new role and represent the public interest of all the people of Hawaii throughout his term.

Thank you."

Senator Kawasaki rose on a point of inquiry and asked if the Chairman of the Committee on Economic Development would yield to a question, to which Senator F. Wong replied that he would.

Senator Kawasaki then asked: "Mr. Chairman, were the concerns expressed by the Senator from the Fifth Senatorial District ever a matter of discussion or inquiry on the part of your Committee?"

Senator F. Wong replied that it had been a subject matter of their discussions on two occasions.

Senator Kawasaki then further queried if the Chairman and members of his Committee were completely satisfied that the results of the inquiry did not in any way indicate at least at this point any direct conflict that is recognizable.

Senator F. Wong then stated:

"It is the conclusion of the members of the Committee that we agree with Senator Yim that there is no evidence or appearance of a conflict of interest on this particular nomination."

Senator Kawasaki went on: "In the event that there appears to be a conflict in subsequent months, let's say, is it the intent of your Committee perhaps to consult with the Governor to perhaps withdraw that appointment?"

Senator F. Wong answered: "Senator Kawasaki, I don't think that we have the authority to ask the Governor to withdraw the matter that we have before us for confirmation since it will be out of the jurisdiction of the Senate. However, there is no question in my mind that as an individual Senator, if some of the concerns raised by Senator Yim are indeed true, that this would be the subject matter of discussion and consideration by the State Ethics Commission."

Senator O'Connor then asked if the Chairman of the Committee on Economic Development would yield to a question, to which Senator F. Wong replied in the affirmative.

Senator O'Connor then said: "I was informed yesterday by a representative from the Department of Land and Natural Resources that Mr. Cobb is requiring Kaluakoi Corporation to redrill wells in order to get saline-free water for this project and is also re-negotiating the terms of the rates which were referred to earlier by my learned colleague. I wondered if the Chairman knows of this and whether or not it is correct."

Senator F. Wong replied: "Mr. President, I do not know specifically that the Chairman is asking that wells be redrilled. I am aware in public testimony that the contract that was referred to by Senator Yim is the subject matter of re-negotiation."

Mr. President, I wish to speak in favor of the nomination and perhaps try to clear up some of the questions that have been asked.

Mr. President, I, like Senator Yim, also share many of the concerns, except that I think that what has been given to us in public testimony clearly indicates that the best interest of the people is being served. Specifically I call your attention to the following:

Mr. Cobb took office in January of 1975. He appeared before the Ways and Means Committee shortly thereafter and was asked about this matter. At that time he indicated to the Committee on Economic Development that relying upon staff recommendations, he felt that the contract that was being proposed was a good one. Subsequent to that meeting, upon his own investigation, he discovered that some of the matters that Senator Yim was concerned about also troubled him and it is his public position at this time that although the Board of Land and Natural Resources in 1973 gave to the Director of the Department of Land and Natural Resources, the authority to execute the contract that he now has before him which has already been executed by the Corporation be accepted, it is his recommendation that the Board rescind that authority and authorize him to enter into negotiations with the Corporation to satisfy many of the concerns raised by Senator Yim.

The reason I bring this up, Mr. President, is because I think the kind of administrator that we would like to watch out for the public lands and the public interest of our State is one that is readily available to not only discuss these matters with legislators and the public, but who is willing to admit that from time to time that staff recommendations not always be accepted; that he look beyond the staff recommendations and make up his own mind.

In this particular case he has made up his own mind and has recommended that because of the concerns raised by others as well as by his own staff members, that the contract not be executed but be the subject matter of re-negotiation.

I'm satisfied that he is a man that can make decisions on his own and will serve the best interest of Hawaii.

Thank you."

Senator Rohlfing then rose and stated that he was voting for the nominee as he believes there was forthrightness in Mr. Cobb's responses during the discussions held before the Committee on Ways and Means regarding the contract.

Roll Call having been ordered, the motion to advise and consent to the nomination of Christopher

Cobb as Chairman, Board of Land and Natural Resources, term to expire December 31, 1978, was put by the Chair and carried on the following showing of Ayes and Noes:

Ayes, 21. Noes, 4 (Chong, King, Leopold and Yim).

Standing Committee Report No. 1134 (Gov. Msg. No. 296):

Senator Takitani moved that Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1134 be received and placed on file, seconded by Senator O'Connor and carried.

Senator Takitani then moved that the Senate advise and consent to the nomination of Ambrose J. Rosehill to the Board of Regents, University of Hawaii, seconded by Senator O'Connor.

Roll Call having been ordered,

the motion to advise and consent to the nomination of Ambrose J. Rosehill to the Board of Regents, University of Hawaii, term to expire December 31, 1978, was put by the Chair and carried on the following showing of Ayes and Noes:

Ayes, 25. Noes, none.

At 9:50 o'clock p.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 10:00 o'clock p.m.
