Thursday, April 1, 1976

The Senate of the Eighth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1976, convened at 11:30 o'clock a.m., with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by Bishop Herbert Kahikina of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Forty-Ninth Day.

MESSAGES FROM THE GOVERNOR

The following messages from the Governor (Gov. Msg. Nos. 310 to 312) were read by the Clerk and were disposed of as follows:

Standing Committee Report No. 688-76 (S.C.R. No. 44):

Senator F. Wong moved that Stand. Com. Rep. No. 688-76 be adopted and S.C.R. No. 44 be adopted, seconded by Senator Hara.

At this time, Senator Anderson rose to speak against the resolution:

"Mr. President, I am sorry this resolution did not go to the Committee on Military and Civil Defense.

It's a very popular resolution...and being a part Hawaiian, I'll probably feel the wrath of this...but I think it is an overreaction.

I believe in the ultimate return of Kahoolawe to the State, but the Legislature is being asked to put the Navy in an awkward position. They have their need for the island, and it can probably be phased out on an incremental basis. I am sure they can work with the Mayor of the County of Maui.

I cannot support this resolution. I don't think it is a responsible measure."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and Stand. Com. Rep. No. 688-76 was adopted and, Roll Call having been requested, S.C.R.
