THIRTIETH DAY

Wednesday, March 2, 1977

The Senate of the Ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1977, convened at 11:30 o'clock a.m., with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by Reverend John Sim of the First Southern Baptist Church of Pearl Harbor, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Twenty-Ninth Day.

At this time, the following introductions were made to the members of the Senate:

Senator Yee introduced 23 fifth grade students from Jefferson Elementary School, accompanied by their teacher, Mrs. AuHoy.

Senator Kawasaki introduced Mr. and Mrs. Eisaku Ichii, of Kyoto, Japan, accompanied by their daughter, Mrs. Emiko Fujiwara.

Senator Anderson then introduced 30 Student Government officers from the Kamehameha Schools, accompanied by their teachers, Mrs. Kini and Mrs. Kinnen.

DEPARTMENTAL COMMUNICATION

A communication from the Department of Accounting and General Services (Dept. Com. No. 11), transmitting copies of Bond Fund Statement, Appropriations, Allotments and Expenditures, As of December 31, 1976, and noting that capital improvement projects financed through other funds are not included, was read by the Clerk and was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
