Wednesday, March 23, 1977

The Senate of the Ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1977, convened at 11: 30 o'clock a.m., with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by the Reverend Ralph Hirota of the Church of World Messianity, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Anderson and Ching, who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Forty-Fourth Day.

At this time, the following introductions were made to the members of the Senate:

Senator R. Wong then rose and spoke for the passage of the bill as follows:

"Mr. President, this bill will provide limited insurance protection for investors in industrial loan companies through the creation of a 'Thrift Guaranty Corporation of Hawaii'. Hopefully, this bill will bring about stability in the industrial loan industry and, much more important, Mr. President, restore investor confidence in the industry.

House Bill 230, H.D. 2, incorporates the various recommendations and amendments proposed by the various subject matter committees in both the Senate and the House. In particular, Mr. President, the work done by your Committee on Judiciary is most commendable. This is one measure that has received full investigation and a great deal of legislative input.

This is important and necessary legislation. The Governor has requested immediate passage of this bill.

Therefore, Mr. President, I urge the members of this Honorable Body to vote in favor of this measure.

Thank you."

The motion to pass H.B. No. 230, H.D. 2, on Third Reading, was put by the Chair and carried, and H.B. No. 230, H.D. 2, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO INDUSTRIAL LOAN COMPANIES", having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by not less than two-thirds vote of all the members to which the Senate is entitled, on the following showing of Ayes and Noes:
