Thursday, March 24, 1977

The Senate of the Ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1977, convened at 11:30 o'clock a.m., with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by Reverend Henry B. Sabog of the Our Lady of the Mount Church, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Forty-Fifth Day.

At this time, the following introductions were made to the members of the Senate:

Senator Hulten introduced 100 eighth grade students from St. Anthony's School, accompanied by their teachers, Mr. Weaver, Mr. McCarthy, Mrs. Fulton, Mrs. Ho and Mrs. Collins, and a parent, Mrs. Smotherman.

Senator Ching then introduced the Honorable George R. Ariyoshi, Governor, State of Hawaii.

Senator Yee then introduced Mrs. Melanie Helm, from Molokai, the mother of Mr. George Helm, and Mrs. Emma DeFries.

At this time, Senator Yee rose on a point of personal privilege to speak as follows:

"Mr. President, Mrs. Melanie Helm has been quite disturbed about trying to find her son, George, as well as Kimo Mitchell.

Last week, she called my home, but, unfortunately, I had just left for work. My wife advised her to get in touch with Governor Ariyoshi, as he is a very sympathetic person. Melanie did get in touch with him.

The Governor was able to arrange for a helicopter to take her boys to the

Island of Kahoolawe to search for George and Kimo. Unfortunately, the trip was very brief, only two or three hours at the most. They were not able to make a thorough search of the island.

Melanie came into town this week. Again, she called upon me, as a friend, to help them get two days to search the Island of Kahoolawe. They want to rest their minds...are their sons still alive or are they really gone?

I contacted Captain Caffrey of the Coast Guard. He was very sympathetic to the cause, and contacted Captain Crockett of the Navy. At the request of Mrs. Helm, I also talked to Captain Crockett. They were to report back to me, but to this date have not been able to come up with an affirmative answer.

In the meantime, Scott Shirai, of Channel 2, has been making a documentary film on Kahoolawe. While editing the film yesterday morning, someone noticed two people in the water. They looked very closely and saw two unidentified persons swimming in the water about fifty yards from shore, on the northwest portion of the island. I'm happy to say that, this morning, Captain Crockett went down to Channel 2 to view the film and has confirmed that two persons can be seen in the water...this only goes to show that our request before the Navy is a reasonable one.

We don't know if they are the Helm boy and the Mitchell boy, but we are making every effort to get permission from the Navy to grant the wishes of the parents of these two young men.

In behalf of the Helm and Mitchell families, I do hope the Navy will grant their last wish."
