#### TWENTY-NINTH DAY

Tuesday, February 28, 1978

The Senate of the Ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1978, convened at 11:30 o'clock a.m., with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by Reverend David Saludez of the Kalihi Baptist Church, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Kawasaki and R. Wong, who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Twenty-Eighth Day.

The following introductions were then made to the members of the Senate:

Senator Yee introduced 56 students from the sixth grade at Hawaii Baptist Academy, with their teachers, Mrs. Darlene Kaneshiro and Mr. Tim Kaneshiro.

Senator Anderson introduced two groups of senior citizens--twenty members from Ka Lima Hana o'Lono in Kaimuki and twenty members of Hui Neneu from Nanakuli.

# MESSAGE FROM THE GOVERNOR

A message from the Governor (Gov. Msg.
