FORTY-FIRST DAY

Thursday, March 16, 1978

The Senate of the Ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1978, convened at 11:30 o'clock a.m., with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by Reverend Terrence Watanabe of Our Lady of Good Counsel Church, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Hara, Kuroda, Yee and Yim, who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Fortieth Day.

The following introductions were then made to the members of the Senate:

Senator Anderson introduced 35 members of the Kalakaua Senior Citizens Club.

Senator Anderson also introduced Mr. Steven Kinney, the Administrative Aide to Senator George Deukmejian, who is the Senate Republican Leader in the California State Senate.

Senator Yamasaki introduced Mr. Tom Shibano, a member of the University of Hawaii Board of Regents from Maui, and Dr. Fujio Matsuda who accompanied him.
