

SECOND DAY

Thursday, January 22, 1987

The Senate of the Fourteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1987, convened at 11:39 o'clock a.m., with the Vice President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by the Reverend Robert Fraser of the First Unitarian Church of Honolulu, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Aki, Henderson and R. Wong who were excused.

The Chair announced that she had read and approved the Journal of the First Day.

The following introductions were then made to the members of the Senate:

Senator Hee introduced Bob and Noelani Joy, who are farmers from Hoolehua, Molokai.

Senator Hee also introduced Mrs. Gladys

Brandt, chairman of the Board of Regents of the University of Hawaii, and stated that she is "a great friend and inspiration to me, and certainly to Senator Solomon and Senator Holt."

Senator Kuroda introduced 21 visitors from Fukuoka, Japan, led by Mr. Fumio Hosaka. They are supporters, known as the "Koenkai," of Senator Yoshiharu Takahashi of Fukuoka who has visited Hawaii's Capitol in the past.

Senator Solomon introduced Anthony Collins from Kona, curator of Hulihee Palace.
