The Senate of the Fourteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1987, convened at 11:40 o'clock a.m., with the Vice President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by the Reverend George Kendall of the First Christian Church, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators George, Holt, Ikeda and McMurdo who were excused.

The Chair announced that she had read and approved the Journal of the Fifth Day.

Senator Chang then introduced to the members of the Senate Mr. Benny Rodrigues, state president of the United Public Workers, Local 646.

SENATE RESOLUTION

S.R. No. 2, entitled: "SENATE RESOLUTION RELATING TO THE ADOPTION OF THE RULES OF THE SENATE," was offered by Senators Hee and Menor, and was read by the Clerk.

On motion by Senator Hee, seconded by Senator Menor and carried, S.R. No. 2 was

adopted.

Senator Blair, on a point of personal privilege, then stated:

"Madam Vice President, before moving to adjourn, I would like to request of the Chair that the vote on the motion to adjourn today be a rising vote in memory of Ellison Onizuka, the Challenger crew, and all the other brave men and women who have given their lives in the exploration of space. Today being the anniversary of the tragedy, I would further like to request of the Chair, in making the rising vote, that we stand in silence for 73 seconds which was the duration of the Challenger flight, in memory of the Challenger crew."

ADJOURNMENT

At 11:49 o'clock a.m., on motion by Senator Blair, seconded by Senator Henderson and carried, the Senate adjourned until 11:30 o'clock a.m., Thursday, January 29, 1987, on a rising vote, observing a moment of silence, in memory of the late Colonel Ellison S. Onizuka and his crew mates of the space shuttle Challenger, and the brave men and women who have given their lives to the space program.
