

TWENTY-SECOND DAY

Friday, February 20, 1987

The Senate of the Fourteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1987, convened at 11:41 o'clock a.m., with the Vice President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by Brother Douglas Zlatis, Principal of Damien Memorial High School, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Fernandes Salling, Holt, Mizuguchi, J. Wong and R. Wong who were excused.

The Chair announced that she had read and approved the Journal of the Twenty-First Day.

The following introductions were made to the members of the Senate:

Senator Kuroda introduced 12 students from Peniel Educational Ministry in Pearl City, and their principal Mr. Charles Underwood and teacher Mrs. Yvonne Knock.

Senator Aki introduced Mr. Shigeya Goto, executive vice president of All Nippon Airways and president of ANA Hotels, Hawaii, Mrs. Goto, and Mr. Toru Ichikawa of ANA Enterprises and general manager of the international hotels development division, who are visiting from Japan.

Senator Aki also introduced Mrs. Millie Ludwig, Hawaii liaison officer for All Nippon Airways and representative of the ANA Hotels.

Senator Chang introduced 17 members of the Taiwan Manufacturers Association who were sitting in the gallery and said, "They are the leading manufacturers in Taiwan and have been students at the East-West Center for the last ten days studying communications, economic variables and industrial techniques. They will spend the next ten days touring major U.S. cities."

Senator Chang also introduced Mr. Cheng Chang Chi, Mr. Chen Fu Lung, Mr. Li Chang Shen and Mr. Hou Kuo Kuang, representatives of the Taiwan Manufacturers Association who were present on the Senate floor, accompanied by Professor Cheng who organized their study at the East-West Center.

At this time, the representatives rose to be recognized and were presented with the Senate Certificate by Senator Chang.

At 11:48 o'clock a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 11:55 o'clock a.m.

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS

Senator B. Kobayashi, for the Committee on Health, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 4) recommending that the Senate advise and consent to the nomination of John C. Lewin, M.D., as Director of Health, in accordance with Gov. Msg. No. 89.

In accordance with Senate Rule 33, action on Stand. Com. Rep. No. 4 and Gov. Msg. No. 89 was deferred until Monday, February 23, 1987.

Senator McMurdo, for the Committee on Tourism and Recreation, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 5) recommending that S.B. No. 1712, as amended in S.D. 1, pass Second Reading and be recommitted to the Committee on Tourism and Recreation.

On motion by Senator McMurdo, seconded by Senator B. Kobayashi and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 1712, S.D. 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO TRANSIENT ACCOMMODATIONS," passed Second Reading and was recommitted to the Committee on Tourism and Recreation.
