Wednesday, April 22, 1987

The Senate of the Fourteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1987, convened at 11:47 o'clock a.m., with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by Chaplain (Lt. Col.) Kenneth L. Alexander of Fort Shafter, Office of the Chaplain, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Fifty-Sixth Day.

The following introductions were then made to the members of the Senate:

Senator Chang introduced Mr. Robert G. Reed III, representing Hawaiian Independent Refinery, Inc., who was present on the Senate floor, as follows:

"Mr. President, it is my pleasure to recognize a unique corporate contributor to our state and to the entire Pacific. Hawaiian Independent Refinery, Inc. (HIRI) is celebrating its 15th anniversary and the following accomplishments.

"It is a major supplier of energy to Hawaii consumers, the U.S. military, and the Its vast Hawaii-produced Pacific. oil stockpiles provide a hedge against international energy crises. As an international citizen, HIRI spreads Hawaii's dynamic business potential throughout the Pacific, and as a responsible corporate citizen, HIRI generates 1,260 jobs in the state, gives generously to the PRI spearheads Foundation and water conservancy technology for crude oil refining.

"As a wholly-owned subsidiary of Pacific Resources, Inc., HIRI stands as an example of Hawaii's ability to lead in the international economic market, and offers expanding opportunities in science and technology for all of Hawaii's future.

"Accepting the Senate Certificate on behalf of HIRI is Mr. Robert G. Reed III, chairman of the board of Pacific Resources, Inc."

Mr. Reed rose to be recognized and was presented the Senate Certificate by Senator Chang.

Senator Chang also introduced Ms. Andrea Simpson, vice president of communications at Pacific Resources, Inc., and Ms. Susan Kusunoki, supervisor of governmental activities at Pacific Resources, Inc., who accompanied Mr. Reed and were sitting in the gallery. Senator J. Wong introduced Mr. Bill McRae, engineering manager at Rockwell International, Southern Regional Office, Huntsville, Alabama, and Mr. Bud Brux, systems engineer at Rockwell International in Long Beach, California, and said:

"Mr. President, this afternoon we'll be having an informational briefing on a new concept called the 'SYNCHTRANS' in mass transportation. With us today is the inventor of the system, Mr. Bill McRae, and his good friend and colleague, Mr. Bud Brux. They'll be here to brief us on 'SYNCHTRANS.'"

Senator J. Wong also introduced Lance Tominaga, a journalist student at the University of Hawaii, assigned to the Legislature to observe the duties and responsibilities of a legislator.

Senator Cobb, at this time, added his remarks on the introduction of Mr. Robert Reed as follows:

"Mr. President, it's always a pleasure to welcome visiting dignitaries, especially so today when I'm pleased to look at my boss. I wanted to ask for a conflict ruling before I elaborated on what I'd like to say in addition that more than just the economic development aspect of Hawaiian Independent Refinery and over and above acquisition of Shell Oil stations here.

"I think the members of the Senate should be made aware of just how much of a contribution Pacific Resources, Inc. makes in terms of energy independence or a lessening of our dependence on Arab oil not only in the refining process, not only in heat pumps, not only in solar panels, but in a variety of other ways. The steps are very important. Some are large, some are small, but it's a very significant contribution that's being made to lessen wherever possible our dependence in foreign sources of fuel.

"I think, Mr. President, that is extremely good for America and I just wanted to take this opportunity to publicly say mahalo to Mr. Reed. I don't have an opportunity to do that very often. Thank you."

At 11:55 o'clock a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 12:00 o'clock noon.
