

## FIFTY-EIGHTH DAY

Thursday, April 23, 1987

The Senate of the Fourteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1987, convened at 11:54 o'clock a.m., with the Vice President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by the Reverend David Schiewek of the Hawaii Church for the Deaf, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Fernandes Salling, Holt and R. Wong who were excused.

The Chair announced that she had read and approved the Journal of the Fifty-Seventh Day.

The following introductions were then made to the members of the Senate:

Senator Kuroda introduced a group of students from Leeward Oahu as follows:

"Madam Vice President, there are 30 students at the Capitol today, 15 of them are in the House, representing Campbell and Nanakuli High Schools, and 15 are in the Senate, representing Pearl City, Waipahu, and Waianae High Schools. The students are here under the sponsorship of Senate Vice President Young, Senators Aki, Menor, Mizuguchi and myself.

"Accompanying the students are Mr. Stan Tsukamoto from Waipahu High School, Mrs. Linda Tanaka from Waianae High School, and Miss Joanne Abe from the Leeward District Office."

Senator Kuroda also introduced Robert Nelson who is with Belt Collins & Associates and "who has an interest in the proposed Diamond Head golf course."

Senator Kuroda also introduced Captain (Ret.) George Roberts, seated on the floor of the Senate, as follows:

"Madam Vice President, this morning we have the honor of recognizing someone who has served our country and the State of Hawaii for many, many years. He is Capt. George Roberts, United States Army, Retired, who is the director of the Hawaii District, United States Customs Service.

"As you are all aware, customs activities are very important to the United States and especially to this entry state of Hawaii. Capt. Roberts has been very helpful to residents and as well as non-residents as they come through United States Customs Service.

"Capt. Roberts is a young 79-year-old. The mandatory retirement age for federal

workers used to be 70. He is one of those who challenged that and the United States Government then recognized that there are individuals who are good workers beyond the statutory mandated age and he is one of those who has proven and continues to prove that one can really provide services to government and the people, regardless of age.

"Capt. Roberts is also recognized as the commanding officer of the MP Company in which one 'Billy Club' Wong served in the period around 1959. 'Billy Club' Wong got his name because as a National Guard MP (military policeman) he worked and served with the military personnel and worked the streets of Hotel Street. The active military personnel hesitated to take action on certain individuals and along came Richard 'Billy Club' Wong, Senate President Wong, who used his billy club to get the sailors in order. And here's the commander who knows our 'Billy Club' Wong, Senate President.

"At this time, I would like to introduce Captain George Roberts." (Capt. Roberts rose to be recognized.)

Senator Chang introduced a group of seven exchange students from the Hiroshima YMCA in Japan, accompanied by Mrs. Sakae Fujii, coordinator, and said: "They were here for eight months and will be returning to Japan next month. They have been participating in the YMCA International Business School program."

Senator Ikeda then introduce Reid Mizuguchi, the 1987 ILH Baseball Player of the Year, as follows:

"Madam Vice President, I have a very special introduction to make this morning. Most of you know about my very short career as a softball player with the House of Representatives team. Well, I want to announce that I am officially retired now, but I still take a great interest in the game, as well as in baseball, especially when teams like Kaiser are in the forefront. However, today my introduction is for a competitor.

"Today, we are honoring someone who has achieved a very special place in Hawaii high school sports. He is the 1987 ILH Baseball Player of the Year — Reid Mizuguchi.

"Reid has proved to be an anomaly in this age of sports specialization. In the midst of designated hitters and pinch-hitters and pinch-runners, he shines not only as a consistent and effective pitcher, winning five of six games in the regular season, but

also is an outstanding batter with 37 hits in 21 games and a batting average of .529.

"Reid is remarkable as a batter. He hit safely in all of Punahou's regular season games. His coach, Pal Aldridge, commented that he had never seen a more dominating hitter in the league. He said, and I quote, 'It's hard to find a guy who can really light up this league. .... He just dominated the offensive game.' Eric Texidor, St. Louis' baseball coach agreed, although from the point of view of an opponent. He said, 'He tore us up in all three games. .... We don't know how to pitch to him.'

"What makes Reid so distinctive as a ballplayer is that he has also excelled as a pitcher. He pitched a no-hitter during the regular season against Hawaii Baptist, and just yesterday led his team to victory in the first round of the state tournament.

"At this time, it gives me great pleasure to introduce to this honorable body the ILH Baseball Player of the Year, Reid Mizuguchi. With Reid, this morning, is his mother, Harriet Mizuguchi. And coincidentally, his father happens to be here also, State Senator Norman Mizuguchi."

The honoree, who was present on the Senate floor, and his parents rose to be recognized and were presented the Senate Certificate of recognition by Senator Ikeda and leis by various Senators.

Senator Mizuguchi then acknowledged the introduction and said:

"Madam Vice President, I just want to thank Senator Ikeda for bringing my family to the State Senate. It's been a while since I've seen them. Thank you very much, Senator Ikeda."

At 12:09 o'clock p.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 12:14 o'clock p.m.

On motion by Senator Blair, seconded by Senator George and carried, Conf. Com. Rep. No. 3 was adopted and H.B. No. 1025, H.D. 1, S.D. 1, C.D. 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HEALTH PLANNING AND RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT AND HEALTH CARE COST CONTROL," having been read throughout, passed Final Reading on the following showing of Ayes and Noes:

Ayes, 19. Noes, none. Excused, 6 (Fernandes Salling, Holt, Hagino, Henderson, Kuroda and R. Wong).

Senator McMurdo, chairman of the Committee on Human Services, requested a waiver of the 48-hour Notice of a Public Hearing on S.C.R. No. 97 and S.R. No. 106, and the Chair granted the waiver.

Senator Nakasato, for chairman of the Committee on Planning and Environment, requested a waiver of the 48-hour Notice of a Public Hearing hearing notice on Gov. Msg. No. 266, and the Chair granted the waiver.

#### RECONSIDERATION OF ACTION TAKEN

Senate Bill No. 1744, S.D. 1, H.D. 1:

Senator Nakasato moved that the Senate reconsider its action taken on Thursday, April 9, 1987, to disagree on S.B. No. 1744, S.D. 1, seconded by Senator Blair and carried.

On motion by Senator Nakasato, seconded by Senator Blair and carried, the Senate agreed to the amendments proposed by the House to S.B. No. 1744, S.D. 1, and that S.B. No. 1744, S.D. 1, H.D. 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT SECURITY," was placed on the calendar for Final Reading on Friday, April 24, 1987.

Senator Solomon rose on a point of personal privilege and remarked:

"At this time, Madam Vice President, I'd like to thank the Hawaii Tribune Herald for giving credit to Representative Andy Levin for saving the irradiation plant facilities for the papaya industry.

"As you well know, Madam Vice President, this is a very controversial issue on the Big Island and being that I was not on that particular committee, I would like to thank the Senate, Senator Chang as well as Senator Matsuura and of course Senator Yamasaki, for their participation in working and trying to work out a reasonable solution in trying to help save our papaya industry in the Big Island and throughout the State of Hawaii.

"It just irritates me when I read this kind of articles in the newspaper, giving credit to Representative Andy Levin whom we all know, Madam Vice President, killed the bill for the irradiation facility. Although the Representative says in the article that he is still opposed to irradiation he feels more comfortable with the compromise position that was reached.

"Thank you, Madam Vice President."

Senator Matsuura also rose on a point of personal privilege and said:

"Madam Vice President, I also would like to make a comment on the irradiation facility.

"As all of us know, in the proviso it requires an EIS, an environmental impact statement. I know of no other state or the Federal Government requiring an EIS. If we in the Senate totally agree to doing an EIS first, prior to the construction of that facility, I just want to put in the record, the Journal, that as sure as I am standing here this afternoon, the EIS will trigger the very thing that I have been always cautious about and that is a contested case, because an EIS will require a public hearing and from there you'll have a contested case, Chapter 91, and this irradiation facility would become in limbo again for at least one year.

"So, I just want to put in the Journal that this EIS has been put in the proviso as a delay tactic. Now I'm thinking like a lawyer — the lawyer that wants to stop the project. I just want the record to note that I am predicting this to happen, even if the EIS shows a totally negative impact.

"Thank you, Madam Vice President."

#### RECONSIDERATION OF ACTION TAKEN

Senate Bill No. 1325, S.D. 1, H.D. 1:

Senator Aki moved that the Senate reconsider its action taken on Thursday, April 9, 1987, on S.B. No. 1325, S.D. 1, H.D. 1, seconded by Senator Blair.

Senator Aki explained:

"Madam Vice President, the House measure has removed unnecessary language. They set an effective date to the repeal of this measure."

The motion to reconsider the action was put by the Chair and carried.

On motion by Senator Aki, seconded by Senator Blair and carried, the Senate agreed to the amendments proposed by the House to S.B. No. 1325, S.D. 1, and that S.B. No. 1325, S.D. 1, H.D. 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDS," was placed on the calendar for Final Reading on Friday, April 24, 1987.

Senator Cobb then rose on a point of personal privilege and said:

"Madam Vice President, I had intended to be at a press conference this morning called by my colleague, Senator Mary Jane McMurdo, but an Army physical at Tripler held me up, and while many of us who have been donating blood involuntarily here in conference committee, I'm doing the same thing with the United States Army. In this case, almost a pint's worth at Tripler, and I was unable to join Senator McMurdo at the press conference but I would like to add my remarks to hers in that conference very briefly, if I may.

"I am happy to join my colleague, Senator McMurdo, in sharing this important and timely information about pending Congressional action relating to Fort DeRussy.

"The detailed report of the House Armed Services Committee, which drew upon the hearings conducted here in the recent past, makes it clear that in the view of the committee, and in the view of Senator McMurdo and myself also, that the powerful Appropriations Committee include from the U.S. Congress their statement that there is no surplus land at Fort DeRussy.

"The reasons are easily stated: The needs of the United States military forces, which by law and tradition include all active duty components, the reserves and the retired, more than fully utilize the Fort DeRussy area. Moreover, there is a continuing need for a military recreational area in the Pacific, and in recognition of the fact that the military personnel can be posted to distant locations for long periods, and thus need and deserve such a recreational area

for gathering with families and friends when time and duty permit.

"I observe also that the committee report deals with conflicting legislation of the past, establishing that, for once and for all, Fort DeRussy is an essential Department of Defense element.

"This is good news, for it will enable the Army to get on with upgrading and improving Fort DeRussy with planned landscaping, building maintenance, and force structure enhancements. You and my colleagues may be certain that the Army will continue to be a good host for the thousands who utilize the area, be they military or civilians, all enjoying this open and green space in Waikiki.

"I might also add for the record that I have received communication to the effect that Congressman Ronald Dellums who is the chairman of the Subcommittee on Facilities has corresponded with the Army asking why they have not proceeded ahead with planned improvements and further construction that's already in the pipeline and has been in the pipeline for a number of years. And we expect such further improvements to begin based on the inquiry of the House Subcommittee chairman of the United States Congress.

"Thank you."

At this time, Senator Chang, on behalf of the chairman of the Committee on Transportation, requested a waiver of the 48-hour Notice of a Public Hearing on H.C.R. No. 60 and any other House concurrent resolutions as may be referred to the committee this afternoon, and the Chair granted the waiver.

At 1:02 o'clock p.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 1:04 o'clock p.m.

Senator Hee, chairman of the Committee on Conference of the Senate Committee on Judiciary, requested a waiver of the 48-hour Notice of a Public Hearing on S.B. No. 787, S.D. 1, H.D. 1, S.B. No. 769, S.D. 1, H.D. 1, and S.B. No. 255, H.D. 1, of said Conference Committee's hearing notice for Thursday, April 23, 1987, and the Chair granted the waiver.

Senator McMurdo also rose on a point of personal privilege and stated:

"Madam Vice President, Senator Cobb mentioned the press conference that I had this morning which was about the just released HASC report, which was based on the hearings they had here in December and what their findings and conclusions were. I

think it's important for the City of Honolulu and the State of Hawaii to realize that the committee is adamant about seeing the property at Fort DeRussy remain in open space for the use of not only the Armed Services, but for the general populace. Also, the report recommends the Army continue its beautification of DeRussy. They have designated DeRussy as the primary Pacific Armed Services Recreation Center. This is the only one in the entire Pacific area.

"The wording which they put in the Defense Authorization bill referring to no-sale of Fort DeRussy and designating it as the primary Pacific Armed Services Recreation Center was upheld by the entire

House Armed Services Committee, unanimously, and will go to the floor of the House approximately the first week in May.

"One more thing, for anyone who would like to see the full report, I have copies in the office. I have distributed some to committees who are interested in the DeRussy matter and if anybody else wants to see it, you're welcome to it. Thank you."
