Wednesday, March 2, 1988

The Senate of the Fourteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1988, convened at 11:40 o'clock a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by the Reverend Charles Crane, Holy Nativity Church, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Fernandes Salling and George who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Twenty-Fourth Day.
