

EIGHTEENTH DAY

Friday, February 10, 1989

The Senate of the Fifteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1989, convened at 11:38 o'clock a.m. with the Vice President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by the Reverend Gary Secor of St. John Apostle and Evangelist Church, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Chang, Ikeda, Mizuguchi and Solomon who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Seventeenth Day.
