

FORTY-THIRD DAY

Monday, April 2, 1990

The Senate of the Fifteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1990, convened at 11:35 o'clock a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by Chaplain Raymond W. Johnson, USACH, Fort Shafter, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Forty-Second Day.

Senator Chang then introduced Bob and Cathy Goldsmith as follows:
