Tuesday, April 3, 1990

The Senate of the Fifteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1990, convened at 11:39 o'clock a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by the Reverend David McClure, Unity Church of Honolulu, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senator B. Kobayashi who was excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Forty-Third Day.

Senator Tungpalan, on behalf of Senators Mizuguchi, Menor and herself, introduced the participants of the Pearl City High School Positive Program as follows:

"Mr. President, the Positive Program was established at Pearl City High School in 1988 to assist potential youthat-risk in dealing with drug and alcohol abuse, suicide, pregnancy, and delinquency through a three-pronged approach, including a peer education program, a student assistance program, and a community action group.

"The Peer Education Program (PEP), jointly funded by the Departments of Health and Education, utilizes peer education techniques to increase student awareness regarding these issues. The 16 peer educators are trained in teaching about decision making, refusal skills, communication, and values clarification. Over the past two years they have reached out to approximately 1,000 students through this program.

"The Student Assistance Program offers support groups in building trust, coping with chemically impaired families, being aware of and confronting chemical use, and making a commitment to remaining drug free.

"The community action group, comprised of representatives of area businesses, education, athletics, church, community, and service organizations, works toward increasing public awareness of problems and supports efforts to rectify these problems.

"The Positive Program has had such a 'positive' impact upon the community that Pearl City High School has been nominated for federal recognition as a drug free school.

"Today, we'd like to recognize four peer educators -student participants in the PEP -- Ray de la Cruz, Robyn Uyehara, Celicia Elderkin and Valencia Wiggins. Also on the floor are Hazel Shintani and Sharon Oie, counselors and group co-facilitators for the Student Assistance Program.

The honorees rose to be recognized and were presented the congratulatory Senate certificate and leis by various Senators.

Senator Tungpalan also recognized and introduced a group of teachers and students who were seated in the gallery: teacher Sandra Cruze, the Drug Free Schools coordinator for Pearl City High School, and PEP teachers, Kathy Tanaka and Joanne Ing, and their 11th graders from Pearl City High School.

Senator Matsuura then introduced Mr. Chuck Furuya as follows:

"Mr. President, it gives me great pleasure and honor to introduce Chuck Furuya, Master Sommelier.

"In 1989, at the age of 35, Chuck Furuya became the world's youngest person to earn the title of 'Master Sommelier' from the British Court of Master Sommeliers, an elite international organization dedicated to perpetuating the high standards and traditions of wine.

"This prestigious title of 'Master Sommelier' is the most coveted achievement among wine stewards and Chuck Furuya is one of two masters in the state and one of only twelve masters in the United States.

"I didn't realize how difficult it was to become a master sommelier. There are less than 50 in the whole world that have ever passed the exam to attain the title of 'Master Sommelier.'

"Chuck has just returned from having examined candidates who underwent the test to attain this title, and out of eight only one passed. In this entire world, there are only about 30 active sommeliers still alive and working.

"Mr. President, there is a slight conflict in making this introduction because Chuck is my nephew. He is the son of my sister.

"Mr. President, it gives me great, great pleasure to introduce Master Sommelier Chuck Furuya."

Mr. Furuya, seated on the floor of the Senate, rose to be recognized and was presented a lei by Senator A. Kobayashi.

Senator Blair then introduced a group of 5th grade students from Lunalilo Elementary School, their teachers, Mrs. Allie Yamaguchi and Ms. Maureen Maedo, and parent-chaperone Mrs. Sandi Shimabukuro who were seated in the gallery.

At 11:49 o'clock a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.
