Monday, April 16, 1990

The Senate of the Fifteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1990, convened at 11:59 o'clock a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by Daiva Das, International Society for Krishna Consciousness, Hawaii, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Forty-Ninth Day.

The following introductions were then made to the members of the Senate:

Senator Crozier rose to speak in support of S.R. No. 225 and S.C.R. No. 243 as follows:

"Mr. President, S.C.R. 243 and S.R. 225, are resolutions urging retailers to refrain from selling 'zig-zag' brand and other cigarette rolling papers.

"Mr. President, what I have before me is a blown-up version of what 'zig-zag' paper looks like. I'm sure half of my colleagues know what 'zig-zag' paper is and the other half does not know. So, to those of you that know what 'zig-zag' is please indulge me while I explain to our colleagues that don't know what 'zig-zag' paper is.

"Mr. President, 'zig-zag' paper or other brands called 'Job,' or '125,' are papers originally used when your great-grandfather came over from China and my great-grandfather came over from New Zealand, and they used this to roll tobacco. But times have changed; times have changed dramatically. Almost nobody uses these papers to roll tobacco. What they do use it for is to roll 'pakalolo' to make cigarette joints or 'pakalolo' joints.

"In these resolutions, I'm asking retailers not to sell this product anymore. The reason we're asking them is that all too often government has to mandate what we should do. I don't appreciate the encroachment of government on people. We let people off the hook. We gotta make people committed to be responsible individuals, and I'd like to comment as to why.

"Mr. President, what this does is to ask retailers to join with our young people, parents, teachers, ministers, community leaders, civic-minded individuals who are in the throes of battle against the most insidious cancer that has crippled our great nation. No one can argue about the many lives that have been lost or ruined because of the 'drug sub-culture' that has permeated throughout our community. Young teenage minds who are in the midst of making the painful transition from childhood to young adult are often irrevocably damaged or warped because the use of drugs at this critical period in their transition often misshapes the values that are being formulated within that young person's personality.

"These resolutions ask the retailers to refrain from selling rolling paper, it does not mandate the merchant from selling it. The reason it only asks them to stop the sale is because too often people expect government to solve every problem that arises. The difficulty with that is every time government denies an activity another stone is added to the basket of limitations that free people must

bear. We don't need another limitation but what we need is to awaken the spirit of good men and women to join in the fight. We need to have the whole community participate in their fight against drugs. We do not want to limit freedom but what we want is to have the 'social conscience' of these good people reawakened. We need to have the merchants realize that their role in the community is not limited to delivering products to the consumer at a reasonable and fair price. Supermarkets, convenience stores, 'Mom and Pop' stores are all part of the fabric of our community. When youngsters go into one of these stores they know they must conduct themselves in a given manner because the authority figure, be it the cashier, manager or owner, will reprimand them or even bar them from the premises.

"When the young person enters the same store and sees the 'zig-zag' or other rolling paper on the shelf, they know that the paper is being used for only one thing. And that is to roll 'pakaololo.' When they see it in a store they assume that the store condones the use of marijuana. If the authority figure in the community is willing to sell the paper, then he or she is willing to support the smoking of dope. The sale of the paper is an implicit message by the store owner that smoking dope is an acceptable activity. Mr. President, we all know that this is not true. However, beliefs and values of youngsters are shaped based on perceptions and not on facts. They are vulnerable to misinterpreting implicit messages that are sent out.

"Mr. President, I have written letters to many owners of stores, be it supermarkets, convenience or small 'Mom and Pop' stores, asking them to stop the sale of these rolling paper. I've had quite a bit of success, Mr. President. Already I've gotten a response from Foodland. Foodland has taken these papers off the shelf. Food Pantry, Mr. President, has also taken these papers off the shelf. ABC Stores have taken these papers off the shelf. Times Supermarkets and Star Supermarkets have taken these papers off the shelves. All of these store, Mr. President, just because that letter and the resolutions were heard.

"Mr. President, I ask my colleagues, people in the gallery, and people across the State of Hawaii, the next time they go to a store just quietly ask the manager ... you don't have to get into a big controversy ... just ask straight to the manager, 'Manager, could you please take this product off the shelf.' You'll be surprised how fast you can get results.

"Mr. President, I won't belabor the point but I'd like to leave with one thought and it's taken from our State Constitution. It is Article I, the Bill of Rights, Section 2, Rights of Individuals: 'All persons are free by nature and are equal in their inherent and inalienable rights. Among these rights are the enjoyment of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness, and the acquiring and possessing of property.' This is the main phrase, right here, Mr. President. 'These rights cannot endure unless the people recognize their corresponding obligations and responsibilities.'

"Mr. President, I ask the merchants, on behalf of all decent people, to awaken their 'social conscience' and recognize their corresponding obligations to join in the 'fight against drugs' by removing 'zig-zag' and other types of rolling paper from their shelves.

"I ask my colleagues to support these resolutions and, also, when you're in the community just quietly ask the merchants that you see selling this, 'Why are you selling it? Can you support the fight against drugs and take it off your shelf?'

"Thank you, Mr. President."

Senator Matsuura also in support of the resolutions said:

"Mr. President, I totally agree with the previous speaker and I want his speech to be incorporated in the Journal as mine, and I congratulate the Senator from Makakilo for taking this step. Thank you."

Senator Solomon, in support of the resolutions, said:

"Mr. President, I'm going to be voting for these resolutions with reservation. I'd like to have that noted.

"Although I agree with the previous speakers in my support of saying 'no' to drugs, I don't know if urging retailers to refrain from selling 'zig-zag' brand and other cigarette rolling paper is really going to aid in that effort.

"As a matter of fact, Mr. President, I'd like to note that I have many persons in my district actually roll their own cigarettes and I feel that they should have that prerogative.

"So, I don't know. I'm kind of caught in a 'Catch 22' situation here. While I understand the intent of the resolutions, picking on just one commodity, philosophically, I find that very difficult. We do have people within the State of Hawaii that still do roll their own cigarettes and enjoy doing that, and I'm just wondering how that would affect them with the passage of these resolutions.

"Because we're simply urging retailers to refrain from selling, I'm going to be supporting these resolutions with reservation. Thank you."

Senator Cobb also spoke in support of the resolutions and said:

"Mr. President, in the State of Wyoming, the definition of a cowboy is someone who can ride a horse at a full gallop, backwards, and roll a cigarette with one hand in the middle of a blizzard. I'm afraid that with measures like this the cowboy is going the way of a dinosaur in the passage of history. But I recognize what the Senator from Makakilo is saying that times do change, and the drug fight is important. But I do share the Senator from Kohala's concern also that people who do want to have the right to roll their own should be able to acquire it through legitimate sources. Thank you."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. No. 243, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION URGING RETAILERS TO REFRAIN FROM SELLING 'ZIG-ZAG' BRAND AND OTHER CIGARETTE ROLLING PAPERS," was adopted.

At this time, the Chair made the following announcement:

"Members of the Senate, the Chair has been informed that the casket of our late United States Senator Spark Matsunaga will be here in the Capitol rotunda at 1:15 p.m., tomorrow. For those that want to pay their respects, it will lie in state until 1:15 p.m. on Wednesday."

Senator Matsuura, in memorium to the late U.S. Senator Spark Matsunaga, remarked:

"Mr. President, it is always difficult to say a few words for a person who has dedicated his life to his country and to the people of Hawaii.

"Most of us have experienced the unique pleasure of breaking bread and drinking the famous Senate bean soup at the Capitol. All of us have heard of the story when Secretary Haig mistook Senator Matsunaga as one of the Japanese diplomats at the reception line at the White House. These stories are a reflection of Sparky's generosity and humble character.

"Everyone in Congress knew of Senator Matsunaga's long working hours. I often wondered what fueled him to work fourteen hours a day. When I heard him speak on alternative energy and the peace institute, it was then that I realized that he had a very noble mission.

"Yes, he had a dream. His dream was the peace institute. To some, it may have been an impossible dream, but to him, it was a dream he knew he must accomplish. He knew that to accomplish that goal, the people of this world cannot go hungry. For this reason, Hawaii is the leader in alternative energy and ocean technology. Part of his dream was to share that technology so everyone in this world would share in the 'fruits of the green and blue revolution.'

"Spark Matsunaga also knew that the peace movement must begin in the Pacific and he knew he could count on

the people of Hawaii's Aloha spirit to be the catalyst to get his dream to come true.

"If we want to honor Senator Sparky Matsunaga, then let us all pick up his torch and strive onward to make his dream a reality. We owe it to him; the people of this world need it; and God demands it. Thank you."

Senator Cobb added his remarks as follows:

"Mr. President, I rise and add some remarks on what the Senator from the Big Island said about the passing of our late United States Senator.

"One of the few times in my life that I ever saw Sparky angry was over the issue of reparations for those who were unjustly imprisoned during World War II. And the anger was directed at the hypocrisy that he saw at the delaying tactics that he witnessed at the lack of willingness of those to redress what was a terrible, moral wrong in our history. Yet, even through that his sense of humor came forward.

"Many people knew Sparky as 'a nice guy.' But on that issue of reparations, he showed persistence, tenacity and the human feelings of anger and frustration in lobbying all of his colleagues and having 72 Senators of the United States co-sponsor the legislation to provide for reparations for Americans of Japanese ancestry.

"He was a man born and tempered in difficult times who rose in war to become a man of peace. Mr. President, it will be impossible to fill his shoes. One could only follow in his footsteps.

"And I would like to ask that in adjourning today, Mr. President, we do so in honor of the memory of our late United States Senator. Thank you."

Senator Blair added his remarks as follows:

"Mr. President, for one man to be a poet and a politician, to be both a warrior and person who will be remembered for his efforts to establish the peace academy, shows remarkable breadth. He will be dearly missed. I therefore request that we adjourn with a rising vote and a moment of silence, in the memory of our dear friend United States Senator Spark M. Matsunaga."

ADJOURNMENT

At 12:51 o'clock p.m., on motion by Senator Blair, seconded by Senator Reed and carried, the Senate adjourned until 11:30 o'clock a.m., Tuesday, April 17, 1990, on a rising vote and a moment of silence in memory of a friend, the late United States Senator Spark M. Matsunaga.
