Wednesday, March 11, 1992

The Senate of the Sixteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1992, convened at 11:50 o'clock a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by the Reverend Mary Taylor, Director, Catch the Vision Enterprises, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Aki, George, Hagino and Nakasato who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Thirtieth Day.

Senator Matsuura then introduced to the members of the Senate Ms. Leslie Wilcox as follows:

"Mr. President, it gives me great pleasure to honor Leslie 'Mac' Wilcox as one of the top-rated television anchor persons in Hawaii.

"I don't know if the movie 'Network' gives an accurate account of what goes on in a television station but this much I am certain of. When the floor director signals with his or her hand -- five, four, three, two, one -- and points to Leslie, Leslie has already condensed a fiveminute television interview into a 30-second news spot, giving the news as it happened, accurately.

"I have always placed Mr. Walter Cronkite as my number 10 in news broadcasting. Today, I want Leslie to know that as far as I am concerned, she joins the ranks with Walter Cronkite.

"What qualifies her is her character and personality which she portrays to the viewing public, what she is to her family and, also, what she contributes to the community. She is truly a living example of the 'aloha spirit.' No person can portray the 'aloha spirit' without feeling it, because it must come from the heart.

"Mr. President, it gives me great pleasure to introduce to this honorable body Leslie Wilcox."

Ms. Wilcox, seated on the floor of the Senate, rose to be recognized and was presented the congratulatory Senate certificate by Senator Matsuura. Senator Yamasaki presented her a lei.
