Wednesday, April 8, 1992

The Senate of the Sixteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1992, convened at 11:40 o'clock a.m. with the Vice President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by Bishop Patrick K. Kanekoa, The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Chang, Crozier and Wong who were excused.

The Chair announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Forty-Seventh Day.

Senator B. Kobayashi then made the following introduction to the members of the Senate:

"Mr. President, tomorrow, April 9th, is the 30th anniversary of the recognition of the Diamond Head State Monument. On April 9, 1962, in acknowledgment of the vision and dedication of citizens and organizations concerned with the growth in development and environmental degradation around Diamond Head, Governor William F. Quinn set aside public lands within and around Diamond Head for a monument. He did this in Executive Order 2000.

"The recognition of Diamond Head is merely a reflection of the grandeur of one of Hawaii's most recognized landmarks. Subsequent to this event, the Legislature in 1965 established the Diamond Head State Monument pursuant to Act 249, Session Laws of 1965. And, again, in 1975 included in the monument adjacent lands for the protection of the monument.

"The 30th anniversary recognition of the Diamond Head State Monument is an appropriate time to recognize certain individuals who were key to that significant event.

"We have on the floor with us some of those individuals. It is with pleasure that I ask you to recognize former Governor William F. Quinn. (Governor Quinn stood to be recognized.) With Governor Quinn are three women, long active with the Outdoor Circle, who helped bring about this achievement and who have been stewards of our environment and of Diamond Head --Mrs. Alice Woolaway, Mrs. Luci Phaltzgraff and Mrs. Cynthia Marnie.

"Joining them in the gallery are: Mrs. Allan Davis and Mrs. Betty Crocker; Mr. Alan Voronaeff of the Kapiolani Park Preservation Society; and a supporter of the Diamond Head State Monument and organizer of this event, Mrs. Michelle Matson."

Former Governor Quinn, Mrs. Woolaway, Mrs. Phaltzgraff and Mrs. Marnie stood to be recognized and were presented the Senate certificate of recognition by Senator B. Kobayashi and leis by various Senators.

Senator A. Kobayashi then stood to introduce Mr. Tom Heinrich as follows:

"Mr. President, seated in the audience today is a staff attorney who formed a 'revolutionary committee' among our staff members, some of whom are Charlotte Nekota, Sally Preston, Ruth Itamura, Ann Yamamoto, Karen Nakasato, Celeste Nip, Mike Imanaka, Marc Matsuura, Lacene Terri, Steffiny Masada, and several others. He is Tom Heinrich. Today is Tom's birthday, and I would like to ask Tom to stand to be recognized." At 11:48 o'clock a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 11:53 o'clock a.m.

Senator Ikeda then rose to speak on a point of personal privilege and said:

"Mr. President, I rise to speak on a point of personal privilege.

"I didn't want to prolong yesterday's session, particularly because it went so long, but I have to tell you that the headline in the Tuesday's Advertiser, 'Guards go free despite jail sex charges,' really bothered me. I think it's wrong that this kind of activity is going on and its even worse that these people are charged with criminal behavior yet none of them have been prosecuted.

"It seems to me that this on-going occurrence has been quietly swept under the rug. I have to ask, 'Does the system feel that women prisoners have no rights and guards are free to take advantage of them? Is this why this whole situation is being ignored?' If that is the case, what is it saying about our society and about our feeling about women in general?

"Sexual misconduct by a guard is a crime by allowing guards to get away with this. The system is saying to women in general that it's alright to abuse women because women don't count. Society treats them and regards them as second class citizens. We must not allow this perception to continue and go unchallenged.

"Mr. President, we have done a lot in this Legislature as well as through the Women's Caucus to call attention to crimes against women. I don't think we should shirk our responsibility now. I don't think that because these women happen to have committed a crime against society and are incarcerated that they deserve any less justice than anyone else. I think that this grave injustice must be corrected and it should be done now.

"Since an administrative investigation is obviously inadequate, then perhaps a criminal investigation should be conducted. I don't think that we should sit here and allow this to go unnoticed.

"I want to know who these people are. I want to know what happened to them. I want to know if they are still in the system and if they are still working as guards. And if they are, where are they and in what capacity. I want to know who's monitoring their current behavior as well as their future behavior and, more so, I want to know why they can commit a crime and get away with it.

"Mr. President, I'm going to ask the chairmen of the appropriate committees, the Committee on Judiciary and the Committee on Public Institutions, to look into this matter and to report back to us and, if necessary, Mr. President, that we take stronger action on our own rather than allow this behavior to continue.

"We've been warned by a front page story. We should not allow the issue to be buried even though the session might end. Thank you."

Senator Solomon, also on a point of personal privilege, said:

"Mr. President, on a point of personal privilege, rising to speak in support of the previous speaker. I would also encourage the committees on Public Institutions and Judiciary to investigate the matter and perhaps be able to report back to the Senate body as to the allegations and investigation.

"Thank you."

Senator Fernandes Salling also rose on a point of personal privilege and remarked:

"Mr. President, I too rise to support the previous speakers' request to look into this serious matter."

Senator Matsuura also rose on a point of personal privilege and said:

"I just want to add that this is not only of interest to the women, it is also involves all of the men to at least find out what happened. Thank you."

Senator A. Kobayashi also rose on a point of personal privilege and stated:

"Mr. President, I would like to thank the Senator from Hawaii Kai for bringing up the issue and bringing it to the forefront. I know we will all be supporting her efforts."

Senator McMurdo also rose on a point of personal privilege and said:

"Mr. President, I would like to add my support. I feel exactly the same way as the Senator from Hawaii Kai does. All of us do. I think this is very important."

Senator Tungpalan also rose on a point of personal privilege and stated:

"Mr. President, I do wish to add my support also to the effort to look into the matter that was brought forth by the Senator from Hawaii Kai. It seems as though we are targets not only for the destruction of our heiaus, as it seems to be the case in Halawa, but also as we are dealt with in criminal matters.

"Let's hope that in the end, when we look at the tally of bills that pass, it will not reflect that this Legislature is in like mind with some of the matters that we have seen reported in the paper yesterday.

"Let us show them that we stand firm against violence in our homes, against violence in the work place and this certainly is one of the tributes I think we can add to the body of knowledge and the body of laws that will be passed this year."

Senator McMurdo then rose on a point of personal privilege and said:

"I wonder if the President would ask Senator Tungpalan to get a new microwave oven or at least let the smoke go toward Senator Iwase's office, the next time this happens, or cook brownies." Senator Tungpalan responded:

"The temperature in my room is very hot. There are several issues, unfortunately, which have caused me to have a rise in temperature and I hope that it cools down, Senator, so won't be getting anymore heat from my room. Thank you."

Senator McCartney rose on a point of personal privilege and said:

"Mr. President, I too rise to support the Senator from Hawaii Kai on the issue of the women's prison. Wrong is wrong and right is right and we have to get to the bottom of this moral issue and I want to commend the Senator for taking a stand."

Senator Cobb also rose on a point of personal privilege and stated:

"Mr. President, rising in support of the remarks of the Senator from Hawaii Kai, I rise on point of personal privilege on an entirely different matter that has been in the press.

"On the subject travel, repeatedly the press has asked, 'What are the economic benefits in flying off to Russia?' My prediction is we will get back ten dollars or more in less than two years for every dollar that has been spent.

"Very briefly, I would like to share with my colleagues some of the hard evidence of on-going economic development already taking place between Hawaii and Russia.

"First example is a sample of diamond film technology on a computer hard disc from the Kurchatov Atomic Energy Institute in Moscow, Russia. What they do is take artificial diamonds and they've invented the technology for this, taking artificial diamonds, crushing them to a thin micron level film which is used to superharden almost any instrument such as a computer disc here (held up disc) or ball bearings or surgical instruments, a whole variety of other applications for business use, will in effect enable continuous acquisition or access of a hard disc on a computer for over a hundred years. It will multiply by 500 the lifetime of a surgical instrument. It will multiply by over 100 the life of a ball bearing. While they have the patent, they offer this, and I have a fact sheet on this for any Senator or member of the media who's interested, from Professor Rizantsev who is the head of that particular division of the institute who invented the diamond film technology.

"I've taken this fact sheet and the information they've provided and sent it to over 100 companies in Hawaii and over 200 on the mainland. A number have already contacted the Kurchatov Institute and placed orders. Their savings on this will be quite substantial even though it's impossible to quantify the business savings at this point in time.

"In addition, a group of local investors is being formed to be on the ground floor for food and other investments in many of the republics. Service is going to be starting from Hawaii with exports not only to Moscow and the university but parts of Siberia. There is establishing now a computer modum network for ordering products directly from Hawaii. Also, with excess to the entire Russian 'E' mail system.

"A number of U.S. automakers are going into five republics. A joint radiation study is going on in Minsk, Belarus, Russia, involving Hawaii and mainland companies. A needs assessment is being conducted to order such items as used agricultural machinery, used baking equipment, silos and even hamburger grinders. Local businessmen, including three who are either Chinese or Hawaiian, have called my office in the last five days contacting me on how to order tuna from the Russians and I put them in touch with the Russian counsel general in San Francisco. These are local businessmen. Ruble conversion is now being developed and refined here in Hawaii.

"The value of just some of these projects is already estimated to be over \$1 million and there is much more to come.

"What I don't like to see is an attempt to quantify the value of every trip because many trips are made for information. But you gather data for use in subsequent legislation here in Hawaii. So in many cases, a dollar value cannot be put on a trip but since it was made an issue, in my particular case, I am willing to respond in detail.

"Finally, I would like to read a very brief editorial because some of the comments I have heard say, 'Ignore what they are doing. Ignore the problem over there and take care of our own.' Mr. President, I wish our local media had the courage to write an editorial like this in the Albuquerque Journal. Since it is brief I would like to share it with members of the Senate:

'A bipartisan delegation that included Sen. Jeff Bingaman returned last week from the former Soviet Union with a frightening vision. But the key man in any effort to stabilize a volatile situation seems too near-sighted to exert the necessary leadership.

'The United States spent trillions to fight the Cold War, a sacrifice made willingly in the face of a formidable, but predictable enemy. In the aftermath, the former Soviet empire splinters into a number of armed camps each of which, though less formidable, is far less predictable. Some have nuclear weapons or expertise in their design.

'Unless we can muster the will to spend a few billion more, the United States could look back on the Cold War years with nostalgia.

'But President Bush is undercut on the left and right by rivals who demagogue against spending any money abroad when people are out of work here.

'Bush should ignore the snipers, get his mind off November and get the voters' eyes on the future. Another putsch by Russian hardliners is not going to put workers back on the line at GM. A series of regional brush-fire wars that could escalate out of control won't make the homeless less cold at night.

Policies that ease the shaky republics over the hump, let seeds of freedom and free markets take root and grow into trade partners instead of partners in enmity could create jobs and secure an era of peace. Exercise leadership and the election will take care of itself.'

"Thank you, Mr. President."
