

## FORTY-SEVENTH DAY

Wednesday, April 14, 1993

The Senate of the Seventeenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1993, convened at 11:37 o'clock a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by Minister Diava Das, ISKCON Hawaii, Inc., Hare Krishna, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Mizuguchi, Nakasato and Tanaka who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Forty-Sixth Day.

The following introductions were then made to the members of the Senate:

Senator Tungpalan presented members of the Pearl City High School soccer team, seated on the floor of the Senate, as follows:

"Mr. President, my fellow colleagues, it's an honor and a privilege to be able to present the senior members of our Pearl City High School Athletic Association/Nissan Girl's Soccer Tournament team. They have won not once, not twice, but three times! Their excellence is probably due to the fine coaching and the fine support that our Pearl City High School team has.

"We have with us the following: coaches Archie Chun and Al Watanabe; players -- Nicole Arakawa, Dayle Liu, Cherise Mishima, Stacey Nakagawa, Jerlene Shimizu, and Karri Watanabe."

The team members and their coaches rose to be recognized. Senator Tungpalan presented the Senate certificate of recognition and leis were presented to each of them by various Senators.

Senator McCartney, on behalf of Senators Chang and Tungpalan, then presented members of the Hawaii Pacific University (HPU) Sea Warriors Basketball Team, as follows:

"Mr. President, it's my privilege and honor to make this introduction. You know, over the summer we had the Olympics and the 'Dream Team.' In Hawaii, we also have a dream team -- the HPU Sea Warriors. We all know how well they did by becoming the NAIA champions this year.

"I'd like to share a little story with you. I had the opportunity to work with Hawaii Loa College, and you all know that Hawaii Loa merged with HPU and at some point there was a little controversy about the merger and people weren't comfortable with it. Two great basketball teams, Hawaii Loa and HPU, merged and, under the leadership of Coach Sellitto, became one great team. They were rivals at one time, competing against each other for the NAIA Division 29 championship. In one year, they became one team under Coach Sellitto. It exemplifies Coach Sellitto's leadership ability to bring players together who are on opposing sides and create a dream team which went all the way to Kansas City to win the NAIA championship.

"I had the privilege of coaching two of the individuals, Roger Huggins and Andy Gardiner, who are here today. (I want to ask Roger, 'You know when I asked you to run laps around the school, did you really run the whole lap, or did you take a short cut?' Now you can tell me, after all you are a national champ.' You did, okay.)

"Mr. President, on behalf of the Senate, I would like to extend our congratulations to the HPU Sea Warriors on winning the NAIA 1993 Basketball Championship.

"At this time, I would like to introduce the coach and some of the players sitting on the floor of the Senate: The person who exercises leadership and who has brought the team together and made their dream come true, Coach Tony Sellitto; captain and first team all-American and future NBA star, Roger Huggins; guard and MVP for the tournament, who came in at a very tough time and did a good job, Le Mar Young; the first player ever recruited by HPU and Coach Sellitto, James Williams, a great player; and a real gentleman who came all the way from London with Roger, and they were recruited a few years ago, a great man, Andy Gardiner."

The coach and players rose to be recognized and were presented the congratulatory Senate certificate and leis by several members of the Senate.

Senator McCartney also introduced Russell Dung, assistant coach, and other members of the HPU team who were seated in the gallery.

At this time, Senator Chang rose to read from the Senate certificate, as follows:

"Intercollegiate athletic competition ... acts as the catalyst that binds the attributes of leadership, teamwork, discipline, and dedication, molding participants into cohesive and effective individuals.

"The Hawaii Pacific University Sea Warriors basketball team, under the guidance of Head Coach Tony Sellitto, is the embodiment of these principles. As a result of their dedication, the team succeeded in achieving its goal, the 1993 NAIA Basketball Championship. This monumental accomplishment of the Hawaii Pacific University Sea Warriors basketball team is one to be shared by all who believe that hard work and dedication will be rewarded."

Senator A. Kobayashi then recognized former Senator Mamoru Yamasaki and Mrs. Kiyo Miyamoto who were seated in the gallery.

At 11:49 o'clock a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 11:54 o'clock a.m.

#### ADVISE AND CONSENT

Ldr. Com. Rep. No. 1377 (Gov. Msg. No. 236):

Senator Holt moved that Ldr. Com. Rep. No. 1377 be received and placed on file, seconded by Senator A. Kobayashi and carried.

Senator Holt then moved that the Senate advise and consent to the nomination of MULIUFI F. HANNEMANN for Director of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, term to expire December 5, 1994, seconded by Senator A. Kobayashi.

Senator Holt rose to speak in support of the nomination and said:

"Mr. President, I rise to speak in support of Governor's Message 236.

"Mr. President, it gives me a great deal of pleasure today to speak in support of the appointment of Muliufi F. Hannemann to the position of Director of the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism.

"Contrary to what many believe, Mufi Hannemann was not born in Samoa but right here in Hawaii. In fact he went to Fern School with me and he used to live up Kam IV Road up the street from me. He's a graduate of Iolani School, where Senator Blair graduated from, and Harvard University where I graduated from, where he earned a degree in government with honors -- cum laude. Upon his graduation from Harvard, he was a recipient of a Fulbright Scholarship and pursued an interest in Pacific Island studies at Victoria University in Wellington, New Zealand.

"Since then Mufi has held a number of high level positions which has helped to make him uniquely qualified for this job. As some of the members may know, he has been a vice president for C. Brewer & Co., a White House Fellow in the Office of the Vice President of the United States, a special assistant in the Office of Territorial and International Affairs, U.S. Department of Commerce, and before becoming the acting director of the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, he was the director of the Office of International Relations in the Office of the Governor. This diversity and range of experience, Mr. President, has seasoned Mufi Hannemann, strengthened his abilities, and made him a strong candidate for this job.

"At this time I would like to briefly restate a few major points regarding this position and the candidate who, by the way, is sitting in the audience behind me. The director of the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism is, among other things, the chief officer of the state for the implementation of various economic development programs. During these rough times, the economic health and vitality of this state will, to a large degree, be dependent on the performance of the director. For these reasons, Mr. President, the job requires innovative leadership, initiative and creativity. And the person in the job will need the proper vision and motivation to make it work. By his deeds and actions, Mr. President, I believe Mufi Hannemann is that person.

"In closing, Mr. President, I would like to reiterate my support for the appointment of Muliufi F. Hannemann as our next director of the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism and urge my colleagues to join me in voting in support of Governor's Message 236. Thank you."

Senator Solomon also rose to speak in support of the nominee and said:

"Mr. President, also speaking in support of the nominee and in support of the previous speaker's

remarks, I too would like to encourage my colleagues to vote 'yes.'

"I have worked with Mufi during the political campaign, in his capacity as a corporate leader in C. Brewer on the Big Island and the most recent Hamakua Sugar crisis.

"I can speak for the man's integrity. I think he's done a tremendous job for the Big Island and for the state. Mufi is culturally sensitive to community needs and desires and, in my mind, these are desirable characteristics, especially for those in government administration.

"The Pacific is getting smaller as we move towards a global economy. With Mufi's expertise, not only in local affairs but in the affairs of the Pacific, he can bring a new direction to Hawaii.

"Mr. President, I urge all my colleagues for a 'yes' vote. Thank you."

Senator McCartney added his support of the nominee and remarked:

"Mr. President, I rise to speak in support of the nominee.

"I would like to share two things that stood out in my mind during Mufi Hannemann's confirmation hearing. First, during the hearing he said that he would challenge the status quo to make government work for the people. And then the question that's always asked all the nominees is why do you want this job? What impressed me the most is, he stood right up there and said he's committed to public service, that he wants to make a difference and he wants to serve the people of Hawaii. I think that that truly is the essence of what being in government is all about.

"Mufi told the committee about his mother telling him that there were two things that can make a difference in his life -- going into the clergy or serving in government -- and he chose government. His commitment to the people and making a difference really came forward in that confirmation hearing.

"Mr. President, I wholeheartedly support Mufi Hannemann's nomination and believe he will do a great job for the people of Hawaii."

Senator Chang added his support of Mr. Hannemann and said:

"Mr. President, I'm not going to be speaking for the candidate because my daughter happens to be named after a member of his extended family, but, instead rise to speak because the Chinese business community has urged me to issue a strong statement of support.

"Mr. Hannemann has taken the trouble to extend the state's presence to all sectors of our business community, be it the Filipino Chamber of Commerce, the Japanese Chamber of Commerce, the Chinese and the like. It's his ability to design a spectrum of programs and services that has pleased the members of the business community. Thank you."

Senator A. Kobayashi also rose to support the nominee and said:

"Mr. President, I rise to speak in support of the nominee.

"When Mr. Hannemann was appointed, he went through his department like a cyclone and landed here, landed there, found ways to cut, found ways to streamline, questioned the effectiveness of different programs, and although DBEDT has many responsibilities he did not come to Ways and Means and ask for more money. Instead, he gave back -- he gave back to the treasury over \$3 million. And for that we're very thankful.

"We know he's going to do a great job. He already is doing a great job as director because he's working for effectiveness and quality within his department. Thank you."

Senator Tungpalan added her remarks in support, as follows:

"Mr. President, I also rise to speak in favor of the nominee.

"I had an opportunity to work with him during our Onipa'a Centennial observance events, and he wholeheartedly allowed his staff to help us with many of the chores that would have gone undone, had his help not been there. I also have been able to work with him on a recent project which we hope will extend our aloha to France and to Japan.

"I know that this nominee will surge ahead and bring this state into the limelight that we certainly need and tourism will rebound as we all hope it will. Thank you very much."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried on the following showing of Ayes and Noes:

Ayes, 21. Noes, none. Excused, 4 (Levin, Mizuguchi, Nakasato, Tanaka).

Senator Holt then introduced Mr. Muliufi Hannemann, as follows:

"Mr. President, on behalf of the Senate, it's an honor and privilege to introduce Mufi Hannemann, our new Director of the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism.

"He is accompanied here by his wife Gail, father Gustaf, sisters Faialso and Nua, brothers Gus and Nephi, sister-in-law Lydia, nieces Ata and Noel, and cousin Pinenua."

Mr. Hannemann stood to be recognized, together with his wife and members of the Hannemann family.

At 12:05 o'clock p.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 12:15 o'clock p.m.

Senator Koki rose to speak on a point of personal privilege and said:

"Mr. President, I rise to speak on a point of personal privilege.

"I've been getting calls from constituents supporting the Aloha Motors site for the convention center. When I ask them who asked them to call, they say a firm has been calling them, giving them a little information regarding the site and patching them to my office. When I asked them why they are in favor of the Aloha Motors site, they say that it's the fastest and everything is all ready. When I asked them if they realize that it's a leasehold interest, they say they didn't know that. When I asked them more

questions, they began to see that they really did not know as in depth as they need to know on the site. In fact, it gives a false perception of public support.

"You know, this is a very significant project, probably the most significant project we're going to be facing this decade. It is not only in terms of dollars but also dollars being brought into the state. This is a huge jobs bill. It's much better than a large construction project like the transit system because construction projects produce jobs only as long as that project lasts and that money is only recirculating tax dollars.

"A convention center will bring in more money as time goes on and it's fresh money; it's real money; it's not recirculated tax dollars. We need to decide on the convention center site on the merits of the site, not on a public relations effort. The decision is difficult enough to make and I object to what the developers of the Aloha Motors site is doing. Thank you."

Senator B. Kobayashi also rose to speak on a point of personal privilege and stated:

"Mr. President, on the same subject, on a point of personal privilege.

"Calls that are being made for the Aloha Motors site are being made by individuals who are not only being patched through to the Senate, but it seems that there is a conference call being made to our offices without our knowledge. One of the office staff started asking questions of the callers and, the callers not knowing too much about the site, seem to diminish their advocacy for the Aloha Motors site as the questions were asked by the Senate staffer, at which point, in two different instances, it seems the telephone calls were disconnected. So the speculation was that this was a three-party conference call, and the conference call was being disconnected as the callers started changing position from support of the Aloha Motors site to less support for the Aloha Motors site.

"At any rate, we do not know who has been making the phone calls, but we do know that it seems that the individuals who are calling our offices are being put through to our offices somehow in a conference call fashion or a patching-through fashion. I think that this is a new form of telephone democracy but not one that I would suggest is either effective for the advocates of the Aloha Motors site nor one that I would support as part of a free-flowing discussion of the merits and demerits of the convention center. Thank you."

Senator Solomon also rose to speak on a point of personal privilege, as follows:

"Mr. President, I also rise on a point of personal privilege.

"I have distributed to my colleagues a recent article from a most respected magazine on current events in the world -- The London Economist -- entitled 'Hawaii-Paradise Lost' together with my letter to the editor of the magazine concerning that article. Often it takes observers from afar to show us most clearly our situation. Surely this is the case with the Economist. We are on the brink of a political revolution of which we must all be aware of and participate in.

"Attached also is my letter to the editor referring to the article 'Another royal scandal!'

"In regard to Hawaiian entitlements arising from the illegal overthrow of the Hawaiian nation the magazine correctly identifies the challenge of making that issue one

which concerns all of our population -- not merely those of us of Hawaiian blood.

"This session we are considering a critical bill on Hawaiian sovereignty. As one of its authors, the bill politically separates the Hawaiian issues from the general public involvement. The illegal overthrow of the Hawaiian nation and the issues of Hawaiian sovereignty, are not simple -- nor are the solutions. These issues and solutions are too important to the welfare of our state; to make them a Hawaiian racial issue would be short-sighted and self-defeating. We must involve every single person who calls Hawaii their home or calls the United States of America their country. This article has brought this challenge to light and we should accept.

"Thank you very much, Mr. President."

Senator Hagino, at this time, presented Marianita Lopez to the members of the Senate, as follows:

"Mr. President, earlier today, we had the privilege and honor of welcoming two champions -- the state girl's soccer team and the HPU NAIA basketball champions. Now we have a third, Marianita Lopez, who is truly a champion of the people.

"Mr. President, in April 1991 the Hawaii State Bar Association adopted a voluntary program designed to encourage attorneys to provide at least 24 hours of legal services on a no-fee or pro bono basis to indigent people or community organizations. Hawaii Lawyers Care (HLC) is a non-profit organization that refers poverty level people who need legal expertise to attorneys, legal assistants and other advocates who are willing to provide their time and services without charge.

"Marianita Lopez, a partner in the Haleiwa law firm of Saccoccio & Lopez, was one of those volunteers who distinguished herself by accepting every pro bono case referred to her by HLC, sharing the goals set by them to provide the best legal services possible to those in need. She has dedicated her time to more pro bono cases than anyone in the State of Hawaii. I remember reading an article in one of the local newspapers about the many hours she has devoted, a tremendous amount, and I think if she charged for those hours she probably could retire today and live comfortably.

"As a result of her unselfish and deep commitment to the ideals of her profession, Ms. Lopez received the 1992 Hawaii Lawyers Care President's Award for outstanding individual pro bono legal services.

"Mr. President, in this day and age when everyone labors long and hard to earn a decent wage, it is indeed refreshing to acknowledge an individual such as Marianita whose humanitarian nature takes precedence over materialistic acquisition.

"It is my privilege and honor, Mr. President, to present to you and my fellow Senators Marianita Lopez, a distinguished resident of the North Shore."

Ms. Lopez stood to be recognized and was presented the Senate certificate of recognition from Senator Hagino. Senator Gaulty presented a lei.

Senator Hagino also introduced Mr. Paul Saccoccio, husband and law partner of Ms. Lopez, and Hawaii Lawyers Care president Cheryl Nicholson and president-elect Tom Sterling, who were seated in the gallery.

At 12:25 o'clock p.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 12:29 o'clock p.m.
