## FIFTIETH DAY

# Monday, April 19, 1993

The Senate of the Seventeenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1993, convened at 11:36 o'clock a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by Captain Glen McFarland, Chaplain, United States Army Support Command, Hawaii, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Forty-Ninth Day.

The following introductions of guests seated on the floor of the Senate were then made to the members of the Senate:

Senators Matsuura, Tungpalan, George, McCartney, Matsunaga, A. Kobayashi and Holt presented the recipients of the 1993 Distinguished Alumni Award of the University of Hawaii Alumni Association, as follows:

Senator Matsuura presented and introduced Mr. Robert M. Fujimoto and said:

"Mr. President, each year the University of Hawaii Alumni Association recognizes outstanding former students of the University of Hawaii system, awarding such persons the Distinguished Alumni Award. This morning we have seven of the eight 1993 Distinguished Alumni recipients.

"Mr. President, it is my privilege to introduce Mr. Bob Fujimoto of Hilo. Bob Fujimoto has done a lot of things, and I'm not going to read all his accomplishments because that will take a long time. I can only say that I have one thing that I'm very, very grateful to him. He gave me the most wonderful, wonderful woman to be my daughter-in-law. For that I am eternally grateful to him. His daughter is married to my son. I'm very lucky and for that I want to thank you, Bob. Will you please stand up and take the recognition for being one of the recipients of the 1993 University of Hawaii Distinguished Alumni Award." (Mr. Fujimoto stood to be recognized.)

Senator Tungpalan then presented and introduced Mr. William Hiraoka, as follows:

"Mr. President, it gives me great pleasure to introduce a friend of mine. We all know him because of his extensive knowledge of insurance. He was practically my shadow at one point in 1985 when we were attempting to reform the workmen's compensation law.

"I have grown to admire him over the years and it is indeed a pleasure to introduce to this honorable body our friend, Bill Hiraoka." (Mr. Hiraoka stood to be recognized.)

Senator George presented and introduced Mr. Edward Y. Hirata, as follows:

"Mr. President, I have a particular treat. It's a real privilege to introduce an old friend whose paths have crossed with mine on many occasions -- Ed Hirata. I can say a lot of things about him because he's had a long career. I think probably the easiest thing to say is that he can't hold a job. They talk about triple threat people. I guess Ed is quadruple threat because his current endeavor is in the business-

civilian community. He's also, as we all know, been involved with government administration. He's also had a distinguished career in the military. We may all call him 'general' when we feel like it. And in addition to that, he has still, somehow, found time for community service.

"Ed Hirata, please let us greet you this morning." (Mr. Hirata stood to be recognized.)

Senator McCartney then presented and introduced Professor Satoru Izutsu, and stated:

"Mr. President, it's also my pleasure to introduce an outstanding individual, somebody who's given a lot to the community and who cares about the University system very dearly. He's now Professor of Public Health and Psychiatry and Associate Dean of the John A. Burns School of Medicine. He's also been very involved in international public health and is known around the world for his work in the Pacific Basin, Yugoslavia and Romania.

"He has also served the community well as superintendent of the Waimano Training School and Hospital, vice president for Geriatric Care Services of the Kuakini Health System, member of the boards of Homeless Aloha, Inc., the Alzheimer's Association and the Lanakila Rehabilitation Center. I'm speaking about our honoree today, Satoru Izutsu. Please stand to be recognized. Thank you for being here." (Professor Izutsu stood to be recognized.)

Senator Matsunaga, then presented and introduced Mr. Larry Johnson, president of Bancorp, Hawaii, and stated:

"Mr. President, it's my honor, indeed, to introduce another distinguished UH alumnus today. We all know Mr. Larry Johnson has been president of Bancorp, Hawaii, Inc. and its principal subsidiary, Bank of Hawaii, since 1989. And I'm sure we all know that he became the youngest vice president in the bank's history in 1970.

"Mr. Johnson was also the 1992 Aloha United Way chairman, past chairman of the Hawaii Visitors Bureau and the Hawaii Heart Association and past president of the Waikiki Improvement Association.

"But the real reason why I want to introduce Mr. Johnson here today is because Mr. Johnson is also a fellow Sigma Chi. Mr. Johnson, please rise and be recognized." (Mr. Johnson stood to be recognized.)

Senator A. Kobayashi then presented Mr. Kent M. Keith, as follows:

"Mr. President, it's a great honor and privilege for me to introduce Kent Keith. Kent Keith has done so many things. He was selected as a Rhodes Scholar, named one of the Ten Outstanding Young Men of America by the United States Jaycees, was a former director of the state Department of Planning and Economic Development, and is now president of Chaminade University. He has done so many talented things. Best of all, he lives in the 11th Senatorial District and he's also good at singing opera and jazz too. Mr. President and fellow colleagues, Mr. Kent Keith." (Mr. Keith stood to be recognized.)

Senator Holt then presented Professor Alexander Malahoff and said:

"Mr. President, last and not least of the distinguished alumni, it's an honor and privilege to introduce another 1993 Distinguished Alumni of the University of Hawaii -- Professor Alexander Malahoff. He is well-known to those here who take a special interest in ocean science.

"Professor Malahoff is a professor of Oceanography at the University of Hawaii and enjoys the distinction of having received in 1965 the first Ph.D. in Earth and Ocean Science ever bestowed by the University. I'm very privileged to introduce Professor Alexander Malahoff." (Professor Malahoff stood to be recognized.)

Senator Matsuura then rose to inform the members of the Senate that Mr. Walter A. Dods Jr., who was absent on the floor, is also a recipient of the 1993 Distinguished Alumni Award.

The distinguished alumni were each presented congratulatory Senate certificates and leis by various Senators.

Senator Graulty then presented and introduced Aliamanu Intermediate student Annalisa de la Cruz, the 1993 state champion speller, as follows:

"Mr. President, the beauty of our islands is embodied in the spirit of our people, especially our young people. And it's my pleasure this morning to introduce to the members of the Senate the 1993 State Spelling Bee winner, Annalisa de la Cruz. Annalisa spelled 'A-n-n-a-li-s-a.' She is 13 years old and an 8th grader from Aliamanu Intermediate School. May I ask Annalisa to please rise and be recognized. (Annalisa stood to be recognized.)

"Mr. President, Annalisa's accomplishment is made even more remarkable by the fact that English was not her first language. She learned to speak English at the age of 5 and only two years ago came to our islands to live here and join her father and her mother. By practicing three hours a day with her parents and brothers and sisters, and five to six hours on weekends plus hours after school with her coach, she achieved the goal that she set for herself last year, that of winning the State Spelling Bee championship. Proving again, Mr. President, that it is determination and hard work that gets you to the top.

"It's also my privilege and honor to introduce to the members of the Senate Annalisa's parents, Antonio and Madonna de la Cruz, who are in the audience this morning. (Mr. and Mrs. de la Cruz rose to be recognized.)

"On a personal note, Mr. President, Mr. de la Cruz and Mrs. de la Cruz are from Cotabato in the Philippines where I have an uncle who is the dentist with Dole and my uncle used to work on their teeth.

"Also present with Mr. and Mrs. de la Cruz is Annalisa's coach, Mr. Clifford Fukuda, from Aliamanu Intermediate School. (Mr. Fukuda stood to be recognized.)

"Mr. President, it took 18 nerve-racking rounds for Annalisa to emerge as the winner, starting with words like 'prowess,' 'zenith,' 'glycogen,' 'podiatrist,' 'resiliency,' 'drogue,' 'syllogize,' 'coalescence,' 'foreclosable,' 'stratocirrus,' 'lexigraphy,' 'anaconda,' 'hematoma,' 'diligently,' for Annalisa to finally emerge as the champion. And as Annalisa prepares for the National Spelling Bee contest in Washington, D.C., next month it is important for all of us to remember what Annalisa said

moments after taking her trophy. She said, 'You had to think you were going to win and not think negative. And you had to study hard.' Those are words of a winner, Mr. President, and winner is spelled 'A-n-n-a-l-i-s-a.' Thank you, Mr. President."

Annalisa de la Cruz was presented the congratulatory Senate certificate and lei by Senator Graulty.

Senator Levin then introduced a group of students from Hookena School in South Kona, accompanied by teachers Shirley McCoy and Kelly Luzon.

At 11:48 o'clock a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

# STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS

Senator Chang, for the Committee on Government Operations, Environmental Protection and Hawaiian Programs, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1437) recommending that S.R. No. 4, as amended in S.D. 1, be adopted.

Senator Ikeda moved that Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1437 be adopted and S.R. No. 4, S.D. 1, be adopted, seconded by Senator Reed.

Senator Solomon spoke in support of the resolution, as follows:

"Mr. President, I am fully in favor of S.R. No. 4 which requests President Clinton and the Congress to take immediate steps to resolve matters relating to Hawaiian lands and federal trust obligations.

"It is a matter of principle that the U.S. Government correct the wrong it has done to the native Hawaiians.

"As a matter of information, I wish to state that President Cleveland at one time referred the whole Hawaiian question to the U.S. Senate. Senator John Tyler Morgan headed the committee on foreign relations at that time and it was he who led the Senate actions on the Hawaiian issues. Senator Morgan was an annexationist and objected to the report of James Blount, who was sent to Hawaii by President Cleveland to investigate the overthrow of the Queen.

"Senator Morgan's committee held hearings on the Hawaiian issues for 2 months in Washington, D.C., at which time many annexationists from Hawaii and Washington testified. The committee's hearings were highly prejudiced and when the 809 page report was published, Senator Morgan was the only one to sign the report. Other members of the committee, 4 Democrats and 4 Republicans refused to sign. The Morgan Report called for no action and the Senate lulled on Hawaiian matters. In spite of its flawed nature people even today cite the Morgan Report to justify what happened in 1803."

"Mrs. Gladys Brandt is very deserving of this honor and I fully support this resolution."

# ADVISE AND CONSENT

Ldr. Com. Rep. No. 1435 (Gov. Msg. No. 235):

Senator Holt then moved that the Senate advise and consent to the nomination of ROBERT P. TAKUSHI for

Comptroller, term to expire December 5, 1994, seconded by Senator A. Kobayashi.

Senator Holt rose to speak in support of the nominee and said:

"I rise to speak in support of Gov. Msg. 235.

"Mr. President, today, I am pleased to speak on behalf of Robert P. Takushi and to recommend the Senate's confirmation of his appointment to the position of Comptroller in the Department of Accounting and General Services. Mr. Takushi is a product of our public school system. He is a graduate of Kaimuki High School and the University of Hawaii at Manoa where he earned a baccalaureate degree in business administration.

"Upon his graduation from the University he worked as a budget analyst for the Department of Budget and Finance. A few years later, like many of us, he joined the staff of the Senate Ways and Means Committee in the Legislature which was then chaired by former Senator Nadao Yoshinaga. As some of the more senior members of this body may remember, Bob quickly advanced to chief clerk of the Ways and Means Committee, administrator of the Senate Majority Office and, finally, special assistant to the Senate President. During his tenure in the Senate, Bob was admitted to the William S. Richardson School of Law and earned his J.D. degree in He entered the private practice of law shortly thereafter, but the attraction of public service, which was instilled in him by his experience in the Senate, was too strong to resist. He returned to government service in the capacity of deputy director of B&F and later deputy director of DAGS. Since September of last year he has been acting state comptroller.

"Bob Takushi's strong background and sincere desire to serve the people of this state make him an exceptional candidate for this position. In addition, I was particularly impressed by the short but ambitious agenda that he has set for himself and the department. As you know he only has 20 months to go.

"For the benefit of the members, I would like to repeat his three-part agenda because it is indicative of his character and his ability as an administrator. First and foremost on the list is the need to restore the public's trust and confidence in the state's purchasing and contracting procedures. Second is the completion of major capital improvement projects, particularly educational facilities. Last but not least is the rededication of efforts to improve services to other state departments. It will be extremely difficult, Mr. President, to develop a better agenda for action as Mr. Takushi has done.

"For these reasons, I strongly support the advise and consent of the Senate of the appointment of Robert P. Takushi and urge my colleagues to join me in voting in support of Gov. Msg. 235. Thank you."

Senator Matsuura also supported the nomination and said:

"Mr. President, I also would also like to support this nomination.

"I concur with the previous speaker that Mr. Takushi has addressed some of the major procurement loopholes in the procurement process. I trust Mr. Takushi to do his very best to make sure that whatever abuse that is occurring in the procurement process that he will also address all those abuses. With those comments, Mr. President, my support is for Mr. Takushi's confirmation."

Senator Solomon also supported the nominee and stated:

"Mr. President, I also rise to speak in support of Bob Takushi.

"Mr. President, in 1982 I had the privilege of chairing the Committee on Education and Bob served as my budget analyst. I appreciated his commitment and dedication in expediting the committee needs. Those days, Mr. President, the budget was, literally, done manually because Senate offices were not computerized. On a lighter note, I remember asking him, 'Gee, Bob, why isn't this budget item working out?' I had my little calculator in hand and he said, 'Because, Senator, your calculator only goes up to the millions and this is billions.' And I said, 'Oh, that's right.'

"I will always have those fond memories of Bob Takushi, and appreciate his great sense of humor. I urge all my colleagues to vote 'yes.'"

Senator McCartney also spoke in support of the nominee and said:

"Mr. President, I too rise to speak in favor of the nominee.

"I had the privilege of working with Bob on many projects when we were working hard to revamp the whole school construction process. I can say that he's a hard worker; he's dedicated and he truly cares about doing a good job for the public. He has a big task ahead of him.

"If OTEC will deliver all this energy, does that mean you are withdrawing your support for geothermal?"

Senator Matsuura answered:

"No, I expect that when the oil disappears from this earth we are going to need all the electricity produced by OTEC and also by geothermal. The Big Island is going to be the best place to live because we will not be short of electricity on that island. You can see that people are already riding electric vehicles around Honolulu. That's going to be one of the modes of transportation on the Big Island."
