There is in the Senate, an imbalance of responsibility and influence between Oahu and neighbor island Senators. With this in mind Senators Solomon, Baker and Joe Tanaka nominate Senator Fernandes Salling as Vice President of the Senate.

We would appreciate your favorable consideration in this matter.

NOMINATION OF VICE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE

Senator McCartney placed in nomination the name of Senator Ann Kobayashi for Vice President of the Senate, seconded by Senator Matsunaga.

The ballot having been so cast, Senator Ann Kobayashi was declared unanimously elected as Vice President of the Senate of the Seventeenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1994.

NOMINATION OF SECOND VICE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE

The President then announced that nominations were in order for the office of Second Vice President of the Senate.

Senator Levin placed in nomination the name of Senator Dennis Nakasato for Second Vice President of the Senate, seconded by Senator B. Kobayashi.

The ballot having been so cast, Senator Dennis Nakasato was declared unanimously elected as Second Vice President of the Senate of the Seventeenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1994.

At this time, Senator Reed rose on a point of personal privilege and said:

"Mr. President, I rise on a point of personal privilege.

"I find the floor speeches prompted by the struggle for the right to pound the gavel--and in other more tangible ways to enjoy power in the Senate--ironic and disingenuous.

"Ironic because virtually the same speeches have been made in the past--but by the other side. Someone should start a file--open to all senators--entitled: Speeches for the Out of Power. Then the faction that loses power could save time recycling speeches used last year by those in power this year.

"It is ironic that only when they lose power do most elected officials begin posing as the champions of democracy--of legislative reform and openness. It is sad that the public buys into this charade year after year.

"In the seven-plus years I've been in the Senate, I've spoken regularly about the need for legislative reformstanding up on the floor of the Senate with a thoughful list of reforms essential if we are to succeed in returning state government to the people. I reviewed the Senate Journal this morning and found that the only person who ever voiced support for any of my reform proposals was Senator Blair. "As a result, it is difficult if not impossible to take seriously the political rhetoric of Senators who happen to be on the outs this year. Talk is cheap.

"If there is a sincere willingness to return government to the people--to set aside personal interests and concern for being re-elected, let us prove our sincerity by taking the following action this year:

- Pass Initiative, Referendum and Recall ... let the people participate directly by putting issues on the ballot and having the power to recall politicians who forget who they're supposed to be serving. Pass Initiative, Referendum and Recall and make passage of those measures in the House a first condition for passing any House bills on any issues.
- 2. Transcend partisan immaturity. It is mind-boggling that an elected member of this body could actually say he would refuse to serve on any committee chaired by a Republican. This partisan nonsense is not only a product of small-minded bigotry, it is also counterproductive. Once an election is over, all senators should work together regardless of political party affiliation to serve all the people of Hawaii. Committee assignments and chairmanships should be based not on party affiliation but on interest, expertise, experience.
- 3. The Senate should adhere to laws it imposes on other bodies. It is absurd that Chapter 92--the sunshine law--does not apply to the legislature. Of course the sunshine and the public should be allowed into any and all legislative meetings. If elected democrats want to have a meeting of democrats, let them meet outside this building. It is completely inappropriate and contrary to democracy to have closed-door meetings to discuss the people's business.

Open up the decision-making process. Have the courage to abandon the Caucus Room and do your debating and decision-making out here--in the sunshine; in the public view.

The people have a right to know how and where we stand on every single issue.

- Abandon the practice of counting votes in private, in Caucus, and then resubmitting or killing bills rather than expose members to a public floor vote.
- Abolish the all-powerful chairman system and change the function of committees. Have committees screen bills to reduce the number of bills. Don't continue to hide behind committee chairmen to avoid voting on controversial issues.
- 6. Support term limits and genuine campaign spending reform to prevent career politicians and make it possible for more new people to serve in public office. Two terms is long enough for anyone to serve in a particular office. The only interests served by a 30-year incumbent are the special interests.
- Limit the number of bills a particular legislator can introduce, but allow for year-round bill introduction to make it easier for the public to be aware of and discuss proposed legislation.

"I believe that an objective, nondefensive review of many of the policies and practices of the Senate--timehonored though they may be--are designed not to open the process to the people but, rather, to protect politicians and enhance their chances of re-election.

"Therefore, it is an attitude--a consciousness--that must change before real legislative reform will be possible. The reality is that most legislators have come to identify with their colleagues and a particular political party and, as a result, have forgotten who they serve. They have to come to treasure the office rather than the service.

"I know that such criticism is not welcome and not easy to swallow. But I criticize not out of animosity but out of a sincere desire to encourage genuine reform. On behalf of the people who hired us to represent them, I urge this body to set aside partisan bigotry, factionalism and selfinterest and join together as a whole body to implement genuine legislative reform to create a process that is truly open to the public. I pledge my support and energy to any who accept such a challenge."

Senator Chang, rising in response, then said:

"Mr. President, in brief response to the concerns expressed by the Minority Senator from Maui: let me say that I dropped by and chatted with him about these concerns on a collegial basis and we've shared many ideas. While we may not agree on specifics, I can say that both the majority leadership and the minority leadership are committed to implementing many of the reforms that have been proposed, not only by the good Senator, but by many of our members. I think that with the progress we have made in the brief time that we have been in session this year, and by the actions taken this morning, we are well on our way to doing the people's business.

"I believe that the leadership is committed to developing more discussion not only among the democrats, but between democrat and republican, in addressing the many issues and the many problems that are faced by our state today.

"And to that end, I encourage all of our colleagues to visit with one another and not let factionalism or partisanship stand in the way of genuine, full, and sincere discussion about our shared duties. Thank you."
