

TWENTY-NINTH DAY

The Senate of the Seventeenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1994, convened at 11:32 o'clock a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by Commander Ray Umbaugh, Naval Station Pearl Harbor, after which the Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senator Ikeda who was excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Twenty-Eighth Day.
