Senator Fernandes Salling rose on a point of personal privilege and stated:

"Mr. President, I rise on a point of personal privilege.

"In Saturday's Advertiser there was a very good article about airport revenue boosters being sought. I think that some confusion was caused with respect to basically one quote stated by our airport administrator; essentially qualifying these funds of \$1 million for enhancing revenues at the airport -- that these funds would be used for studies.

"I'd like to make these remarks and I hope that this will clarify any misunderstandings, especially on the neighbor islands. We will be sending this release out to them that the \$1 million RFP released by the Department of Transportation, Airports Division, is for a consultant contract to develop and execute a program of activities, events, and so forth, on each island and at their respective airports which will enhance airport revenues and, indirectly, revenues on the island itself. The RFP, a requirement of the new procurement law, is the first time that DOT Airports have financed a project to enhance airport revenues.

"I want to be absolutely clear about the fact that these funds are not to be used to study or to consult, but to actually develop and execute a program within this fiscal biennium. Thank you."
