I'm happy to announce that the amount that the FCC has received within the past few days has risen from \$4 billion to \$6.1 billion. The radio bands have not been auctioned off in Hawaii yet, but I'm sure that the total revenue for the FCC is going to exceed \$10 billion. I promised Senator Fukunaga that all the monies we get will go toward putting in all the telecommunications infrastructures for the public schools and the University.

"The State of California has now joined Hawaii. They have also introduced a similar resolution. Our resolution has been sent to all the State Legislatures. You will see a movement toward the implementation of the resolution whereby the FCC will be asked to share those revenues with the states.
