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At 11:46 o'clock a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 11:53 o'clock a.m.

Senator Holt rose on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"Mr. President, this being Friday and good news day, I have some good news to report to the body. My office received a phone call this morning from Mike Johnson of the Alliance to Revitalize California and Andrew Tobias, the author of 'Pay at the Pump.' They called my office to support Senate Bill 1762 that passed out of the Senate. A letter from Mr. Tobias will be forthcoming. Both Mr. Johnson and Mr. Tobias are currently working on a pure no-fault initiative proposal in California.

"In addition, we received some new numbers on our proposal. Actuarially determined, it is now at 43% savings. Thank you."

Senator Anderson also rose on a point of personal privilege and said:

"Mr. President, may I stand on a point of personal privilege? Actually, I think it's a point of clarity on an article that came out in the paper yesterday.

"It more or less said that Mrs. Kent, who is looking for a facility for the correction facilities for the Feds, says that adding a federal facility for Halawa might present infrastructure problems. However, it says, according to this article, that former Mayor Frank Fasi had a discussion with her.

"At the committee meeting, Mr. President, I asked Mrs. Kent if at any of her discussions with the counties if they had discussed the parcel that's right next to the Police Station, the old Rapid Transit parking lot. (It was never mentioned, because former Mayor Fasi was going to put a \$90 million facility there, and that was in the Pacific Business News.) And she said, 'No, that had never come up.' According to this, it says that it was Mr. Fasi who brought that up with her. It was something that we discussed and I told her that it was available to the best of my knowledge, and maybe she should talk that over with Mayor Harris, who is now in charge.

"I just wanted to clarify that to the best of my knowledge, she was not aware that the parcel was available and it could be used for a federal prison. They have one in San Diego, I understand, right in the heart of town, so consequently that's why it came up.

"Thank you very much and I hope we all have a nice Friday. Mahalo."
