Senator Matsuura rose on a point of personal privilege and stated:

"Mr. President, may I be allowed to speak on a point of personal privilege?

"My point is on the referral of bills. We all know that the public or the common person out on the street rarely knows what goes on in this capitol building. We being elected officials, they depend on us to do things right. I am referring to a single bill to illustrate my point. The legislation is gambling.

"If you were to look at the Senate Rules, you would find that the subject matter in terms of gambling should really be referred to the Committee on Judiciary. However, this bill is being referred to the Committee on Tourism and the Committee on Ways and Means. If you were to ask a number of lawyers -- just at random, a hundred lawyers -- to read our Rules, you would find that. gambling should have been referred to the Committee on Judiciary, and not to Tourism.

"The reason I cite this example is because our institution has always been challenged for integrity and honesty. And I, as part of the Senate, have to answer to these kinds of questions, and I am not going to cover up to show my ignorance. If Tourism is the correct committee to refer the bill, then I would think the House would do the same thing, but you will notice that the House always refers bills such as gambling to the Committee on Judiciary and to their Finance Committee, which is the correct referral.

"The reason I cite this is because it is in the Senate Rules where certain bills are supposed to be referred. I can understand if the leadership really wants the gambling bill passed and there are Senators like myself and maybe Senator Matsunaga and others who oppose the gambling bill in the Judiciary Committee, the President can take us off the Committee on Judiciary and replace us. That's all within the prerogative of the leadership because you have 13 votes. You can even change the committee chairmanship if you want to. The thing that I want to stress is that when we make an exception to the Senate Rules, the exception then becomes the rule, then anything will be allowed. I don't think that it will be an easy task for us to explain to the public why the Senate Rules are being changed. There is a lot of time left in the session so that referrals can be made properly.

"I wanted to express my concerns because if we are to circumvent the Senate Rules and send bills to wherever leadership wants to, I think that our integrity is going to be tarnished. I don't want this body to be tarnished in any way because, as you all know, this is an election year. Thank you very much."

The President then responded:

"In speaking about the Rules, I think that every chairperson has the prerogative to ask for a reconsideration of the Chair's initial referral. I have not heard from the Judiciary Committee chair, so the initial referral stands as is."

Senator Solomon also rose on a point of personal privilege and said:

"Mr. President, I rise on a point of personal privilege.

"This is in regard to the previous speaker's remarks, Mr. President. For the record, I want to be sure that the previous speaker is not impugning the integrity of the Tourism Committee. I take great offense to that. I'm hoping that he's speaking in general terms and not insinuating that the Tourism Committee has no ability to review a bill, such as gambling, and make decisions that would be in the best interest of Hawaii.

"So as the vice-chairman of the Tourism Committee I take great offense and I'd like to give an opportunity to the previous speaker to clear the record, being that all of these remarks are part of our Journal.

"Thank you very much, Mr. President."

Senator Matsuura rose again and said:

"This has nothing to do with the Tourism Committee. I think my comments were strictly based on the Senate Rules and what's in there -- how bills are referred and what are the subject areas that each of the committees are responsible for. It has nothing to do with the chairman of the Tourism Committee or its members. My comments are strictly based on what I perceive to be the proper referral. That's my only concern."

Senator Solomon rose again and stated:

"Thank you, Mr. President, with those remarks I feel relieved and I would just like to thank the previous speaker. I am hoping, Mr. President, that you will take the previous speaker's remarks into consideration. Thank you very much."

The Chair then remarked:

"Is that relief going to remain for the next fifty-five days?" (Laughter.)

Senator Solomon answered:

"It depends on what the other subject matters are, Mr. President." (More laughter.)

Senator Fernandes Salling, rising on a point of personal privilege, added her remarks as follows:

"Mr. President, I would like for you to hear the Transportation and Government Affairs Committee's view on that issue that was raised by Senator Matsuura. Very briefly, last year the bill was introduced. At that time, we reviewed it as to whether or not shipboard gambling should also be referred to Transportation and Government Affairs because it does concern uses in our harbors. We made the determination that it should go to Tourism because it was being considered as part of a package of events to offer tourists. That's how we viewed it. Therefore, I did not make a request for any kind of referral. Of course, that does not necessarily mean that the committee cannot consider what impact it may have on harbors at the proper time.

"Mr. President, I'm sorry I did not mention this was a point of personal privilege in leading up to an announcement. Thank you."

Senator Graulty then rose on a point of personal privilege and stated:

"Mr. President, I feel that I have to rise on a point of personal privilege in light of the previous comments.

"I think that it is incumbent upon me to rise because a member of my committee is unhappy with my ability to comply with the Rules. And I think that I need to state for the record that there are many bills of which many committees feel that they have jurisdiction. Just today, I know that there were some disagreements between chairs as to whether a particular bill should have been referred to this committee, that committee, or wherever. But I think there is a process that is in place, and there is an appeal process for the chairs that are unhappy. And I want to assure Senator Matsuura that despite the fact that the gambling bill may have gone to the Tourism Committee, it is my perception and my view that the bill really has more to do with tourism and economic development than with judiciary. And for that reason I abided by the decision of the Chair.

"But there is a process in place and it is important for all of us to abide by that process. If we are unhappy with the Chair's ruling, there is a process for that as well. I am not aggrieved and I do not feel aggrieved by the referral of that particular bill and I have, I think, carried out my responsibilities as Judiciary chair in conformity with the Rules and abided by the decision that the Chair has made with regard to the referral on that particular bill. Thank you, Mr. President."
