Senator Anderson rose on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"Mr. President, may I stand on a point of personal privilege?

"Mr. President, I did read this morning's paper and I was a little disillusioned. It seems that the convention center has put a number of construction people to work and the administration did it. But whenever anything goes wrong where we don't have repair and maintenance programs done, it's the fault of the Legislature.

"And I was wondering because I've been reading what the DOE said about moneys that they were holding back. I did look at the University of Hawaii -- \$68 million in repair and maintenance that they are not putting through. We're going to be in trouble. The schools look bad; the University is run down. And now we're looking at building another university. But if they're going to hold back money for repair and maintenance, then how are we going to attract new people. Why should we, the Legislature, take on that responsibility of not putting our people back to work in the construction industry where it's badly needed.
