The Senate of the Twenty-Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2011, convened at 11:32 a.m. with the Vice President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Ihara and Tsutsui who were excused.

The Vice President announced that she had read and approved the Journal of the Fifteenth Day.

At this time, Senator Slom introduced Mr. Bryon York, a White House correspondent for *National Review* and *The Washington Examiner* and a weekly columnist for *The Hill*, who was accompanied by his wife Marty on their visit from Washington, D.C.

Senator Slom rose in opposition to the measure and said:

"What we're doing again is raiding the emergency rainy day fund. I know that we have a problem in terms of our deficit and trying to raise money. Instead, what we really should be doing is, as I've said constantly, is to cut our expenditures and look to that; and if we establish funds and we have a purpose for that fund, we should not be using it for other purposes. I have another problem with this bill, however, Madam President. There's a possible error under section 3 of the bill. In terms of the total amount of money that's listed, it's listed for \$1 million, and if you look in page 7 of the bill itself, the actual detail comes to \$965,845. So, there seems to be a missing amount of around \$36,000. If someone could clarify that for me, I would appreciate it. Thank you."

At 11:39 a.m., the Senate stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The Senate reconvened at 11:43 a.m.

Senator Ige rose in response as follows:

"Yes, Madam President, the minority leader is accurate in the sense that that section appropriates \$1 million and then in the detail of that section it designates 'as requested by the administration.' Specific allocations of the million dollars to various nonprofit agencies to perform services; and the minority leader is accurate in that it does not total exactly to the \$1 million, but there's nothing that legally requires us to designate the full allocation. I certainly will have the conversation with the administration to make sure exactly what it is that they had intended; and if there is a further appropriation that we need to make, we'll be discussing that with the House to make sure that it's exactly what is needed. Thank you."

Senator Slom rose in response and said:

"Yes, I just want to thank the Ways and Means Chair for the clarification. Thank you."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, S.B. No. 1288, S.D. 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE EMERGENCY AND BUDGET RESERVE FUND," having been read throughout, passed Third Reading on the following showing of Ayes and Noes:
