# Thursday, February 17, 2011

The Senate of the Twenty-Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2011, convened at 11:33 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Kouchi and Taniguchi who were excused.

My reason for rising is that I hope that the appropriate subject matter chair will seek all information related to this issue prior to bringing his name to the floor for confirmation. Members, the information is readily available online by the Senate. Actually, the Senate media people posted it online through a Civil Beat article. Thank you, Mr. President."

Senator Slom rose on a point of personal privilege and said:

"Colleagues, I don't mean to nag, but this is the 20th day of our legislative session, one-third of the way. We still have not received the budget. That is our primary responsibility. It's making it difficult in all of our money issues and all of the appropriations bills. So, I know you have more influence than I do with the executive branch, but I think we should have the budget so we can get to work. Thank you, Mr. President."
