## Thursday, March 24, 2011

The Senate of the Twenty-Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2011, convened at 11:35 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senators Hee and Kouchi who were excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Thirty-Sixth Day.

At this time, Senator Slom introduced members of the Newcomers Club of Honolulu including President Dick Baie and his wife Michelle, Treasurer C.J. Klug, local tour chairperson Debbie Emerson, and additional members who were seated in the gallery.

#### ADVISE AND CONSENT

Stand. Com. Rep. No. 870 (Gov. Msg. No. 511):

Senator Galuteria moved that Stand. Com. Rep. No. 870 be received and placed on file, seconded by Senator Gabbard and carried.

Senator Galuteria then moved that the Senate advise and consent to the nomination of SUNSHINE TOPPING as the Director of the Department of Human Resources Development, for a term to expire December 1, 2014, seconded by Senator Gabbard.

Senator Galuteria rose in support of the nominee as follows:

"Mr. President, colleagues, I rise in strong support of Sunshine Topping's name—what a name that is—and also strong support for her appointment to serve as the Director of the Department of Human Resources Development. When she appeared before your Committee on Judiciary and Labor on March 9, 2011, all the testimony was extremely positive, expressing enthusiastic support for a highly qualified administrator and public servant. Your committee was particularly impressed by the outpouring of support from DHRD employees who had been working under her direction these past four months. Their testimony described her as personable, energetic, open, and willing to listen and understand. From this, it appears that Ms. Topping's commitment to an inclusive management style is already showing promising results. Sunshine Topping's credentials in the human resources arena, as well as her many volunteer activities in both the Native Hawaiian and wider communities

present a picture of a highly competent professional who has not only visionary goals, but also the expertise to carry them out. Her experience in labor relations, collective bargaining, and other personnel issues, comes from a work history in companies both large and small, both in Hawai'i and on the mainland, the continent. Since returning to her home state 10 years ago, she has worked mainly in the high technology industry and at one point operated her own recruiting business.

"Colleagues, all signs point to Sunshine Topping, born and raised in Hilo, Hawai'i, and a proud product of its public schools, as the ideal person to lead the central personnel office of our state government. I urge you, colleagues, to join with us today, all together, as we give her our unanimous advise and consent to her nomination as Director of the Department of Human Resources. Thank you, Mr. President."

Senator Baker rose in support of the nominee as follows:

"I rise in strong support of this nominee and appreciate the words of our majority leader and would like to echo them. You know, the thing that impressed me the most when Sunshine made an appointment to come to visit with me was her extensive background in human resources. What a novel trait to have in the Director of DHRD. We all know the important role that that department plays for us, but it never gets the recognition or the thanks, I think, for the important role that the Human Resources Department does play in government. We're always complaining about people not getting lists on time, and not having qualified people apply. And so, I think with Sunshine's background and expertise, she can work with the hardworking folks in her department to really bring our human resource division and systems into the 21st century, and I think she'll do our state very well, so I'm pleased to join in support of her nomination."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried on the following showing of Ayes and Noes:

Ayes, 21. Noes, none. Excused, 4 (Hee, Kim, Kouchi, Shimabukuro).

At this time, Senator Shimabukuro introduced Director Topping, who was accompanied by her husband Miles; her children Ka'ehu, Hōkūlani and Paoa; her mother Carol Helekunihi; her siblings Isaiah, Sommer, Keko, Levi, Micah and Rebekah; and her nephews Kahia and Makani who were seated in the gallery.

Stand. Com. Rep. No. 871 (Gov. Msg. No. 527):

Senator Green moved that Stand. Com. Rep. No. 871 be received and placed on file, seconded by Senator Nishihara and carried.

Senator Green then moved that the Senate advise and consent to the nomination of LORETTA J. FUDDY as the Director of the Department of Health, for a term to expire December 1, 2014, seconded by Senator Nishihara.

Senator Green rose in strong support of the nominee as follows:

"Mr. President, I stand in very, very strong support of Loretta Fuddy to become our next Director of Health. To start, though this may be a little bit unconventional, this is an extraordinarily good-hearted person, and that was reflected—before I talk about Ms. Fuddy's professional credentials—this was reflected in the testimony unanimously. It was almost abnormal to see that many people have such an endearing sense of comfort to have the incoming director—should we vote for her in a moment—head the Department of Health. She has been not just respected by her colleagues, but has fought for women and children for decades.

“Loretta began her service to Hawai‘i back in 1975, 35 years of work here at the Department of Health, which is really important in this day and age because there’s so much change going on in the field of health—and this was reflected in the committee hearing—that there was a lot of apprehension that the department wouldn’t have someone that could carry it through into the next era. And person after person in our committee was excited to see that stability return to the Department of Health. Some of the awards Loretta has received also reflect what I’m talking about: Volunteer of the Year in 2000 for the March of Dimes, the Director’s Award for Health Resource Services for HRSA Maternal and Child Health Bureau, Lifetime Achievement Award for the National Association of Social Workers. So, this is a very, very giving person that I’ll be voting for here in a moment to become our next Director of Health.

“Not only was the committee unanimous on behalf of Loretta, but the testimony was actually unanimous, which is no small feat; and we had a couple hundred people write to us and testify. Loretta has worked extensively in the department so we are getting an experienced individual. She was actually the Director of Health back in 2003 as an acting director and has been our acting director for the past two months, which has not been an important point lost on the committee. When we had the radiation concerns from Japan, she performed admirably and has continued to perform admirably in that capacity as director. She also helped us deal with spilled arsenic on Kaua‘i. And I’ll tell you, when the Health Committee called the director to ask her for health information, she was absolutely right on the spot. There’s been no reluctance to reach out to us and help solve problems, knowing full well that she was in transition to this position.

“She’s been Deputy Director of Health, Chief of Family Health Services, Chief of Maternal Health Branch, Perinatal Health Services supervisor. Loretta has really seen the department in the whole, and so she is in a unique position to lead this department, which is enormous: 5,000+ employees, a multi-hundred million dollar budget, and changes coming from the federal side all the time. Even recent work on the tsunami has been impressive from Loretta. So, without getting into much more detail, I can just tell you this is an extremely well-educated individual with master’s degrees in the pertinent disciplines. She studied sociology, which I think really is a good fit for the Department of Health, and like I said, her heart is probably the most significant quality that recommends her as well. So, I’ll sit now, but I do encourage all of us to vote for this extraordinary individual to become our next director. Thank you, Mr. President.”

Senator Baker rose in strong support of the nominee as follows:

“It really was a love fest in the Committee on Health when Loretta’s name was put forward and dozens and dozens of people testified. And I think it’s no secret in these halls that the department was severely impacted with the budget cuts and the morale in the department was very low. But since Loretta, who is passionate and devoted to public health, has come on board the morale has improved; people are working together again and really trying to figure out how to move forward at a time when it may be a year or two more that we have challenges from a budget perspective. Under Loretta’s leadership, she’ll put the focus back on public health and help all of the programs get back on track and hopefully get back to their full speed. She’s tackled some tough issues already at the department and I for one appreciate her leadership. I know the feedback that I’ve gotten from folks over there that I’ve worked with in previous capacities as health chair and as WAM chair really tell me that she has the skill sets, the ability and the heart to move the department in the right direction. So I look forward to

continuing to work with Deliana Loretta Fuddy. As one of the testifiers said, they thought for a long time that there might be two Fuddys around, but no, just one with two different names sometimes, depending on how you were first introduced to her. Loretta, I think you’re going to do an excellent job for the department. We all look forward to working with you because we know that this is a critical department and area for all of our citizens. And with that, Mr. President, I encourage all of our colleagues to join in supporting her.”

The motion was put by the Chair and carried on the following showing of Ayes and Noes:

At this time, Senator Green introduced Director Fuddy, who was accompanied by family members Lewis and Dana Fuddy, and Keith and Samantha Grier who were seated in the gallery.
