Thursday, March 31, 2011

The Senate of the Twenty-Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2011, convened at 11:34 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senator Galuteria who was excused.

The President announced that he had read and approved the Journal of the Thirty-Ninth Day.

At this time, Senators Taniguchi and Gabbard recognized and congratulated Patrick Gartside—web developer, popular rock musician and free-lance writer—for his extreme generosity and self-sacrifice for the benefit of others.
