Senator English moved that Conf. Com. Rep. No. 1 be adopted and S.B. No. 98, S.D. 2, H.D. 1, C.D. 1, having been read throughout, pass Final Reading, seconded by Senator Baker.

Senator Slom rose to speak in opposition to the measure and said:

"I sat through the informational briefing and the hearings on this bill and saw the changes that took place. And while I certainly think parts of the bill that call for more public hearings and more public disclosure from the Public Utilities Commission are warranted, I do not like the overall tenor of the bill, which basically, I feel, is anti-competitive and which is going to continue to make sure that we have a monopoly in water carrier business within the State of Hawai'i. I think that was evidently clear. I think that is the wrong course for Hawai'i. We can instruct the Public Utilities Commission to explore certain areas, but when we require that they take certain action and make sure that we don't disturb the monopoly status that we have right now, I think that's harmful to businesses and to consumers throughout the state. Thank you."

Senator Baker rose to speak in support of the measure and said:

"Colleagues, it would be nice if our water carrier industries between and amongst the islands was as robust as the good Senator from Hawai'i Kai would like it to be. Unfortunately, we have many small ports and many small communities that would not be served if it were totally a free market and there were total competition. So, we do have a regulated market with regard to the movement of goods between the islands, and this measure makes sure that our small ports and our small communities are not going to be disadvantaged by not taking into account the requirements and restrictions for delivering goods to those areas. It's also going to make sure that we have an opportunity to continue to have the availability of barge service carrying agricultural products to and from the islands. Right now, it's the neighbor islands primarily that need to get their produce to O'ahu in order to sell it. And if we are really serious about

sustainable agriculture in our state, we need a measure like this. So, I encourage all of my colleagues to vote in favor of this very important piece of legislation. Mahalo."
